CONSENT ORDER

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Chiropractic Examiners (hereinafter "the Board") upon receipt of an application for reinstatement of the license of Frederick C. Padovano, D.C. (hereinafter "Respondent") to practice chiropractic in New Jersey.

On September 1, 2007, Respondent's license to practice chiropractic in New Jersey expired and has not been renewed. On October 1, 2007, Respondent's license was suspended without a hearing by operation of law pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(b). On November 1, 2010, Respondent pleaded guilty in New Jersey Superior Court, Ocean County, and was convicted of the crime of Theft by Failure to Make Required Disposition, in violation of N.J.S.A. 2C:20-9. On January 7, 2011, Respondent was sentenced to five (5) years probation and the payment of restitution in the total

amount of \$120,000.00 to four victims who had invested in his chiropractic practice. (Copy of the Change of Judgment of Conviction incorporated herein and attached hereto as "Exhibit A").

Respondent's conviction provides grounds for the suspension of his license to practice chiropractic in New Jersey pursuant to N.J.S.A 45:1-21(f), in that he has been convicted of a crime involving moral turpitude and relating adversely to the practice of chiropractic.


Having reviewed the entire record, including the testimony of Respondent before the Court on November 1, 2010, which formed the factual basis of his guilty plea, it appears to the Board that Respondent's license may be reinstated consistent with the public health, safety and welfare, with certain conditions. Respondent having agreed to said conditions being placed upon the reinstatement of his license, and for good cause shown;

IT IS ON THIS 16th DAY OF May, 2011
HEREBY ORDERED AND AGREED THAT:


1. Respondent shall satisfy all requirements for reinstatement set forth in N.J.A.C. 13:44E-1A.4(d), and shall take and pass the New Jersey Chiropractic Jurisprudence Examination.
2. Upon proof of compliance with paragraph 1 above, Respondent's license to practice chiropractic shall be reinstated, but suspended for a period of two (2) years; such period of suspension shall be stayed and served as a period of probation. Such stayed period of suspension shall be activated upon a showing to the satisfaction of the Board of Respondent's non-compliance with any of the terms and conditions set forth herein.
3. Respondent shall satisfy all requirements of his criminal sentence, including making all payments of restitution and fees through probation when due.
4. Respondent shall successfully complete and unconditionally pass the ProBE (Professional Problem Based Ethics) course offered by: The Ethics Group, 89 Summit Avenue, Suite 185, Summit, New Jersey 07901, or the PRIME (Professional Renewal in Medicine through

Ethics) course offered by the Center for Continuing Education in the Health Professions at UMDNJ- Robert Wood Johnson Medical School, 97 Paterson Street, Room 124, New Brunswick, New Jersey 08903, within six (6) months after the date of this Order, and shall provide documentation thereof to the Board.
