**CONSENT ORDER OF
VOLUNTARY SURRENDER**

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") upon receipt of a report on or about December 8, 2010 from Cape Regional Medical Center notifying the Board that respondent Kelly McQuaide's ("Respondent") employment had been terminated by St. Francis Medical Center on Friday, November 26, 2010. Respondent admitted not only to taking Percocet from her employer, but also to having an addiction to the drug. On that same day, Respondent was admitted into the Access Center at Kennedy Health System in Cherry Hill, NJ.

Respondent seeks leave to voluntarily surrender her registration to practice as a pharmacy technician in the State of New Jersey without prejudice and in accordance with the terms of this Order. The Board finds the within disposition adequately protective of the public health, safety and welfare, and other good cause having been shown,

IT IS, therefore on this 29th day of AUGUST, 2011

ORDERED THAT:

1. Respondent is hereby granted leave and shall immediately surrender her registration to practice as a pharmacy technician in the State of New Jersey. Respondent's surrender of her registration shall be deemed a revocation of said registration.

2. Respondent shall immediately cease and desist from engaging in practice as a pharmacy technician, which includes, but is not limited to the following: Respondent shall not retrieve prescription files or patient files; shall not prepare medication labels; shall not engage in data entry for any pharmacy, shall not count, weigh, measure, pour or compound prescription medication or stock legend drugs and controlled substances; shall not fill an automated medication system; shall not accept authorization for a prescription refill or renewal; shall not handle anything requiring a prescription, including devices and medications; respondent shall not handle prescriptions; and shall not be present within a prescription filling area of a pharmacy.

3. Upon entry of this Order, Respondent shall immediately mail Respondent's original registration and most recent renewal card to Joanne Boyer, Executive Director, Board of Pharmacy, 124 Halsey Street, P.O. Box 45013, Newark, New Jersey 07101.

4. Prior to any restoration of registration, Respondent shall:

- a. Appear before the Board or a committee thereof to discuss her readiness to reenter practice as a pharmacy technician. At that time Respondent shall be prepared to propose her plans for future practice in New Jersey.
- b. Provide the Board with evidence that she is capable of discharging the functions of a registration holder in a manner consistent with the public's health, safety and welfare and that she is not then suffering from any impairment or limitation resulting from the use of any addictive substance which could affect her practice.
- c. Provide the Board with documentation of at least one (1) year of sobriety to include, but not be limited to, complete treatment records of all diagnostic and rehabilitative

therapy and an in-depth, current evaluation from a psychiatrist or psychologist knowledgeable in addiction therapy. In addition, respondent shall provide reports from each and every mental health professional (including, but not limited to: psychologists, psychiatrists, counselors, and therapists) who have participated in respondent's care and/or treatment in this matter during the period of time from the date of the incidents giving rise to this Order and her appearance before the Board or a committee thereof to discuss her readiness to reenter practice as a pharmacy technician.

- d. Provide the Board with proof of the resolution of any criminal charges filed against Respondent and compliance with any terms imposed by the criminal authorities.
- e. Provide the Board with a full account of her conduct during the intervening period of time from the entry of this Order to her appearance pursuant to this Order.
- f. Provide documentation of successful completion of all application requirements including a Criminal History Background Check and payment of all reinstatement fees.

5. If Respondent's registration to practice as a pharmacy technician is reinstated, the Board, in its discretion, may impose any conditions or restrictions on that registration it deems necessary to protect the public health, safety and welfare.
