: UNRESTRICTED LICENSURE  
TO PRACTICE MEDICINE AND SURGERY:  
IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY :

On May 19, 2003, Respondent Lance Gooberman, M.D. entered into a Consent Order with the State Board of Medical Examiners that suspended his license for a period of five years, the first two years active, the remainder to be served as a period of probation. The Consent Order required Dr. Gooberman to enroll in and successfully complete such classes as may be designated by the Board in informed patient consent, patient confidentiality, screening procedures for anesthesia procedures and recordkeeping requirements. Dr. Gooberman was to pay \$11,500 in civil penalties and the Board's costs, to be satisfied not later than five years following the date of the entry of the Order.

In addition, the Consent Order set forth restrictions on Dr. Gooberman's providing, directly or indirectly, or his advertising of the procedure he denominated as UROD or Ultra Rapid Opiate Detox, defined in the Order as the administration of any substance, including any opioid antagonist, to any patient where said patient is under the effect of any anesthetic drug or substance and where the purpose of such procedure is to detoxify the patient from the effects of any opioid or any other substance.

On August 25, 2005, the Board filed the Order of Reinstatement permitting Dr. Goberman to commence the three year probationary period. He was ordered to continue making payments toward the monies due. He was prohibited from providing, directly or indirectly or from advertising the provisions of the procedure known as UROD, its substantial equivalent or any variation thereof unless and until he submitted a detailed written protocol for said procedure and received express written board approval to perform such procedure. He was to continue to comply with the Order of May 19, 2003 except for those requirements excepted in this Order of Reinstatement.

In 2009, Dr. Goberman sought removal of the condition of reinstatement with respect to rapid detoxification. The Board by letter dated August 28, 2009 denied removal of this restriction.

On October 26, 2011, Dr. Goberman appeared and testified before a Committee of the Board requesting removal of all remaining restrictions on his New Jersey medical license.

The Board is satisfied that Dr. Goberman has been compliant with the terms of the Order of Reinstatement of Licensure with Restrictions. Further, the Board understands that Dr. Goberman fully intends to comply with payments due and owing the Board.


The Board, having determined that the within Order is adequately protective of the public health, safety and welfare it is on this 18<sup>th</sup> day of July, 2012;
