This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy ("Board") upon receipt of information that Christina Aydt (Respondent) was arrested on January 23, 2012, by the Medford Township Police Department and charged with Theft Of Movable Property, in violation of N.J.S.A. 2C:20-3A, and Manufacture/Distribute Controlled Dangerous Substance, in violation of N.J.S.A. 2C:35-5A(1). Specifically, Respondent stole

various quantities of CDS valued at \$27,000.00, on diverse dates between September of 2011 and January 20, 2012.

The allegations, if proven, would demonstrate that Respondent has engaged in professional misconduct, in the use or employment of dishonesty, fraud, deception, misrepresentation, false promise or false pretense and engaged in acts constituting crimes of moral turpitude and crimes which relate adversely to the practice of pharmacy in violation of N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(b) (e) and (f).

It appearing that respondent wishes to voluntarily enter into an interim agreement without making admissions and the Board finding the within disposition adequately protective of the public health, safety and welfare, and other good cause having been shown;

IT IS on this 2ND day of AUGUST, 2012,

ORDERED that:

1. Respondent is hereby granted leave and shall immediately surrender her registration to practice as a pharmacy technician in the State of New Jersey pending disposition of the criminal charges and until further Order of the Board.

3. Respondent shall immediately cease and desist from engaging in practice as a pharmacy technician which includes, but is not limited to the following: respondent shall not retrieve prescription files or patient files; shall not prepare

medication labels; shall not engage in data entry for any pharmacy, shall not count, weigh, measure, pour or compound prescription medication or stock prescription legend drugs or controlled substances; shall not fill an automated medication system; shall not accept authorization for a prescription refill or renewal; shall not handle anything requiring a prescription, including devices and medications; respondent shall not handle prescriptions; and shall not be present within a prescription filling area of a pharmacy.

4. Respondent shall surrender her original registration to the Executive Director of the Board immediately upon the entry of this Order by mailing same to Anthony Rubinaccio, Executive Director, Board of Pharmacy, P. O. Box 45013, Newark, New Jersey 07101.

5. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed an admission of liability on the part of the Respondent.

6. The entry of the within Order is without prejudice to the further investigation and/or prosecution of any violations by respondent of any statutes or regulations governing the practice of pharmacy in the State or any violations of law, by the Board, the Attorney General or any other regulatory or law enforcement agency, including but not limited to any pending matters under investigation.

7. Nothing herein shall preclude the Board from initiating further disciplinary action based upon the conduct relating to Respondent as alleged above.
