This matter was opened to the New Jersey State of Board of Pharmacy (“Board”) upon receipt of information revealing the following:

1. Respondent, Rachel Sohn, is the holder of Registration No. 28RW001667000 to practice as a pharmacy technician in the State of New Jersey and was registered from on or about August 2008 until she allowed her registration to expire on August 31, 2012.
2. Respondent was arrested on June 18, 2011 by the Highland Park Borough Police Department for 2C:20-2B(1), Theft of Controlled Dangerous Substance.
3. Respondent’s failure to submit her biennial renewal in New Jersey in 2012 has resulted in a lapsed registration status and the automatic suspension of Respondent’s registration to practice as a Pharmacy Technician in the State of New Jersey without a hearing pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1 7.1(b).

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS on this 10th day of JANUARY 2013,
ORDERED THAT:

1. Respondent's registration to practice as a pharmacy technician is suspended by operation of N.J.S.A. 45: 1-7.1(b) without a hearing.

2. Respondent shall refrain from engaging in practice as a pharmacy technician until such time as her registration is reinstated and until further Order of the Board. Any practice in this State prior to such reinstatement and Board Order shall constitute the unregistered practice of pharmacy technician.

2. In the event that Respondent seeks reinstatement of her New Jersey registration at any time in the future, then this Order shall require Respondent to appear before the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy, or a committee thereof, to establish that she is fit to practice pharmacy in New Jersey, is not then engaged in drug use likely to impair her ability to practice and provide evidence demonstrating rehabilitation to the satisfaction of the Board. Additionally, the Board reserves the right to take disciplinary action and place restrictions and/or limitations upon Respondent's registration to practice as a Pharmacy Technician in the State of New Jersey.
