This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Nursing (the "Board") upon receipt of a written petition from Carin Haywood, ("Respondent") to terminate the active portion of a suspension imposed by a Consent Order filed on May 9, 2011. The Consent Order provided that Respondent's license to practice nursing was suspended for two years, with one year of the suspension to be actively served and one year of suspension to be stayed and served as a period of probation. The Order directed Respondent to apply to the Board in writing for

termination of the active portion of the suspension, and to demonstrate compliance with the Consent Order, prior to termination of the active suspension.

The period of active suspension commenced on May 16, 2011. During the period of active suspension, the Order directed Respondent to complete Board-approved courses in critical thinking and ethics. Respondent has submitted proof of successful completion of such courses.

The Board has determined that Respondent has completed the terms of the Consent Order pertaining to her period of active suspension, and that the within Order is sufficiently protective of the public health, safety and welfare; and in lieu of further proceedings, and for other good cause shown;

IT IS on this 25 day of Feb., 2013

HEREBY ORDERED AND AGREED that:

1. The active one year suspension of Respondent's license to practice as a registered professional nurse in New Jersey is hereby terminated.

2. The one year period of stayed suspension, to be served as a period of probation, shall commence upon Respondent's employment as a nurse. Respondent shall notify the Board in writing when she obtains employment as a nurse. During the

period of probation, Respondent is required to report to the Board any arrest, indictment, or conviction for any crime or disorderly persons offense within ten (10) days of the event. Any arrest, indictment, or conviction for any crime or disorderly persons offense within the probationary period shall be considered a violation of probation.

3. Respondent shall obey all the laws of the State of New Jersey, the United States and their political subdivisions as well as all regulations, rules or statutes pertaining to the practice of nursing in the State or jurisdiction in which she practices nursing, as well as the bylaws of any facility at which she works.

4. Any deviation from the terms of this Order without the prior written consent of the Board shall constitute a failure to comply with the terms of this Order. Upon receipt of any reliable information indicating that Respondent has violated any term of this Order, Respondent's license may be automatically suspended by the Board until further Order of the Board. Within fifteen days following receipt of such notice, Respondent may request a hearing to contest the entry of such an Order. At any such hearing, the sole issue shall be whether any of the information received was materially false. In addition, the

Board reserves the right to bring further disciplinary action upon receipt of any new information.
