RE: Final Letter of Disqualification of Homemaker Home Health Aide Certification, With An Opportunity To Reapply Immediately in The Event of a Favorable Appellate Decision.

Dear Ms. Merand:


Records at the Board of Nursing ("Board") reveal that on **September 27, 2012**, you were sent a Notice of Disqualification regarding your certification as a homemaker-home health aide as a result of your conviction(s) of a disqualifying crime pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:11-24.3 et. seq. In that notice you were advised that if you did not respond to the Board within 30 days, as instructed, this matter would be finalized and you would be disqualified from practicing as a certified homemaker-home health aide for two years.

The Board has determined that you have not met the burden of demonstrating that the record of your conviction was incorrect and that you have not demonstrated, by clear and convincing evidence, that you have been rehabilitated. Therefore, you are hereby disqualified from practicing as a homemaker home health aide and you will not be considered eligible for re-certification for two years from the date herein. You may not practice as a certified homemaker home health aide and you may not claim to be certified. You shall immediately forward your original certificate and a money order in the amount of \$100.00 for a civil fine, by certified mail return receipt requested to George Hebert, Executive Director, Board of Nursing, 124 Halsey Street, Post Office Box 45010, Newark, New Jersey 07101.

The Board has acknowledged that you are filing an appeal through your attorney in the Superior Court of New Jersey in Somerset County. If the court renders a decision in your favor prior to the expiration of the two year period of disqualification, you will be afforded the opportunity to immediately apply for reinstatement.

This Final Letter of Disqualification is a final agency action that is considered public disciplinary action and will be reported to the Healthcare Integrity and Protection Data Bank. Further, upon request, the Board may provide copies of the Notice of Disqualification, any response you may have submitted and the Final Letter of Disqualification to members of the public.
