

respondent was charged with possession of oxycodone, dextroamphetamine, and cocaine, as well as theft of the oxycodone and dextroamphetamine from his employer, I.P.P.C. Pharmacy, located in Morganville, New Jersey.

3. Respondent did not renew his registration to practice as a pharmacy technician prior to its expiration on August 31, 2012, and has not renewed or attempted to renew his registration since that time.

4. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(b), any pharmacy technician registration which has not been renewed within thirty (30) days of its expiration date is suspended without a hearing.

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS on this 18th day of September, 2013,

ORDERED THAT:

1. Respondent's registration to practice as a pharmacy technician in the State of New Jersey shall be, and hereby is, suspended by operation of N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(b), without a hearing. Any practice as a pharmacy technician during the period in which respondent does not hold an active registration shall be deemed unregistered practice and shall subject him to disciplinary action.

2. Respondent may not make application for reinstatement until any and all pending criminal charges against him are resolved.

3. In the event that respondent seeks reinstatement of his New Jersey registration, he shall appear before the Board or a committee of the Board: to provide information concerning the facts underlying his dismissal from I.P.P.C. Pharmacy and the arrest and resolution of any and all criminal charges; and to establish that he is fit to practice as a pharmacy technician in this State.

4. The Board reserves the right to deny reinstatement, take disciplinary action and place restrictions and/or limitations upon respondent's registration to practice as a pharmacy technician in the State of New Jersey.
