FINAL ORDER OF
DENIAL OF LICENSURE

TO PRACTICE MASSAGE ANDDD
BODYWORK THERAPY IN THE
STATE OF NEW JERSEY

This matter was opened to the Board of Msssage and Bodywork Therapy (the Board) upon receipt of information which the Board has reviewed and the following findings of fact and conclusions of law are made:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Mei Hua Cui submitted an application for licensure by the Board in February of 2013.
2. On Ms. Cui's application, she indicated she had been arrested in Lumberton Township in 2009 for engaging in prostitution, and was later convicted of Recklessly Creating a Dangerous Condition. Ms. Cui also indicated that she had been required to surrender her massage therapy permit from Lumberton Township in 2009.
3. Ms. Cui has submitted statements suggesting that she entered into a plea agreement without understanding what it

consisted of. Ms. Cui denies having surrendered a massage therapy permit, and explains that the application form was filled out incorrectly by a friend who misunderstood the certificate of disposition of her arrest.

4. The transcript of hearing dated February 1, 2010 from the Lumberton Township Municipal Court indicates that Ms. Cui pled guilty on that date to knowingly or recklessly creating or maintaining [a] condition which endangers the safety or health of a considerable number of persons by offering masturbatory services for money."

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Ms. Cui's conviction in 2010 of offering masturbatory services for money demonstrates that the applicant committed a crime or offense based upon conduct relating adversely to the practice of massage and bodywork therapy within the intendment of N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(f).

Based on the foregoing findings and conclusions, a Provisional Order of Denial of Licensure was entered on July 26, 2013, provisionally denying Ms. Cui's application for licensure. A copy of the Order was forwarded to Ms. Cui by certified and regular mail at her address of record. The Provisional Order was subject to finalization by the Board at 5:00 p.m. on the 30th business day following entry unless Ms. Cui requested a modification or dismissal of the stated Findings of Fact or

Conclusions of Law by submitting a written request for modification or dismissal setting forth in writing any and all reasons why said findings and conclusions should be modified or dismissed and submitting any and all documents or other written evidence supporting Ms. Cui's request for consideration and reasons therefor.

The record reflects that the certified mailing of the Provisional Order as signed for, and the regular mailing was not returned. No response has been received to date. The Board determined that inasmuch as the mailings had been sent to the applicant's address of record, service had been effected. The Board further determined that as no discrepancies had been raised with respect to the findings and conclusions of the Provisional Order, additional proceedings were not necessary, and the Provisional Order should be made final.

ACCORDINGLY,


IT IS on this 4th DAY of October, 2013,
