

**ORDER OF SUMMARY
SUSPENSION**

TO PRACTICE PHARMACY IN THE STATE
OF NEW JERSEY

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy (the "Board") upon receipt and review of the following information:

1. Danny Scarano ("Respondent"), License No. 28RI02900100, was initially licensed to practice pharmacy in New Jersey on August 18, 2003.
2. Respondent is alleged to have diverted Tussionex and Carisoprodol from his employer, Hannaford Pharmacy, in Pine Bush, New York. After being charged with Grand Larceny, on January 5, 2010, Respondent pled guilty to Petit Larceny, a misdemeanor, in violation of New York Penal Law §155.25. In connection with this conduct, Respondent entered into a Consent Order with the New York State Education

Department, Office of Professional Discipline (“the New York Consent Order”). In that Consent Order, effective October 27, 2010, respondent admitted to a charge of professional misconduct, and agreed to a suspension of his license, and other terms.

3. Respondent did not renew his license to practice pharmacy prior to its expiration on April 30, 2009, and has not renewed or attempted to renew his license since that time.

4. Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(b), any pharmacy license has not been renewed within thirty (30) days of its expiration date is suspended without a hearing.

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS on this 23rd day of October, 2013,

ORDERED THAT:

1. Respondent’s license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey shall be, and hereby is, suspended by operation of N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(b), without a hearing. Any practice of pharmacy during the period in which respondent does not hold an active license shall be deemed unlicensed practice and shall subject him to disciplinary action.

2. Respondent may not make application for reinstatement until any and all pending criminal charges against him are resolved.

3. In the event that respondent seeks reinstatement of his New Jersey license, he shall appear before the Board or a committee of the Board: to provide information concerning the facts underlying criminal charges set forth above; the completion of all terms of his sentence of fulfillment of the requirements of the terms of the New York Consent Order; and to establish that he is fit to practice pharmacy in this State.

4. The Board reserves the right to deny reinstatement, take disciplinary action and place restrictions and/or limitations upon respondent's license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey.
