**INTERIM CONSENT ORDER OF
VOLUNTARY SURRENDER
OF LICENSES**

The New Jersey Fire Alarm, Burglar Alarm, and Locksmith Advisory Committee ("the Committee") received information that Danny E. Conde ("respondent"), was arrested on July 15, 2013 and charged with Aggravated Sexual Assault (N.J.S.A. 2C:14-2a(2)(c)), a 1st degree offense, Sexual Assault (N.J.S.A. 2C:14-2c(4)), a 2nd degree offense, Aggravated Criminal Sexual Contact (N.J.S.A. 2C:14-3a), a 3rd degree offense, Endangering the Welfare of a Child by a Person Having a Legal Duty to Care for the Child (N.J.S.A. 2C:24-4a), a 2nd degree offense, Endangering the Welfare of a Child by Permitting a Child to Engage in a Prohibited Sexual Act (N.J.S.A. 2C:24-4b(3)), a 1st degree offense, and Endangering the Welfare of a Child by Knowingly Possessing a Photograph, Film, Videotape, Computer Program or File Depicting a Child Engaging in a Prohibited Sexual Act (N.J.S.A. 2C:24-4b(5)(b)), a 4th degree offense. Specifically, it is

alleged that respondent repeatedly engaged in sexual conduct with his step-daughter from the time she was 14 years old through 16 years old.

The parties have agreed to an interim order of voluntary surrender of respondent's licenses to engage in the fire alarm and burglar alarm businesses in the State of New Jersey pending resolution of the criminal charges and further order of the Committee. This order is entered without prejudice to respondent's ability to defend himself.

Respondent making no admissions, and the Committee specifically reserving its right to take action against respondent based on the conduct underlying his arrest and other information available to it; and the Committee finding the terms of this consent order to be adequately protective of the public health, safety and welfare;

IT IS, therefore, on this 7th day of November, 2013,

ORDERED THAT:

1. Respondent, Danny E. Conde, shall immediately surrender his individual licenses to engage in the fire alarm business and burglar alarm business in the State of New Jersey until resolution of the criminal charges, and further order of the Committee.

2. Respondent shall immediately cease and desist from engaging in the fire alarm business and burglar alarm business, in any capacity, including performing such services as an employee of a fire alarm or burglar alarm business until resolution of the criminal charges, and further order of the Committee.

3. Prior to any consideration of an application for a restoration of his licenses, respondent shall:

a. Appear before the Committee to discuss his readiness to reenter the practice of engaging in the fire alarm business and burglar alarm business. At that time respondent shall be prepared to propose his plans for future practice in New Jersey.

b. Demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Committee that he is physically and psychologically fit and that he is capable of discharging the functions of a licensee in a manner consistent with the public's health, safety and welfare.

c. Provide the Committee with reports from each and every mental health professional (including but not limited to: psychologists, counselors, therapists, psychiatrists) who have participated in respondent's care and/or treatment or provided an evaluation of respondent concerning this matter.


d. Affirmatively establish his fitness, competence and capacity to re-enter the active practice of engaging in the fire alarm business and burglar alarm business within New Jersey, including an accounting of all continuing education courses completed while his licenses were surrendered and during the triennial licensing period prior to the surrender of license.

e. Provide the Committee with a full account of his employment during the intervening period of time from the entry of this Order to the time of his appearance before the Committee pursuant to this Order.

4. The Committee may require respondent to submit to an independent psychiatric evaluation prior to his return to practice. Following review of all relevant documents submitted, the Committee, in its sole discretion, will determine whether and under what conditions respondent may return to practice.

5. The parties hereby stipulate that entry of this Order is without prejudice to further action by this Committee or other agencies or law enforcement entities regarding respondent's conduct.
