

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This matter was first opened to the State Board of Pharmacy upon receipt of information that Kenneth W. Grossett, R.Ph., had applied for an unrestricted license to practice pharmacy. On September 5, 2007, Mr. Grossett entered into a Consent Order in

which he voluntarily surrendered his license to practice pharmacy, based on his diversion of Hydrocodone and Celebrex from his employer's active stock; obtaining Hydrocodone without a prescription; and defrauding insurance companies by forging and filling three Hydrocodone prescriptions. The Consent Order required, among other things, that Mr. Grossett participate in the New Jersey Professional Assistance Program (PAP), complete Pretrial Intervention, and pay restitution to his employer CVS Pharmacy for the cost of the diverted medications.

On March 25, 2010, a Consent Order of Reinstatement was issued, granting Mr. Grossett a restricted license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey. This Order was granted based on evidence presented by Mr. Grossett indicating he was in compliance with all of the requirements of the 2007 Order, including active participation in PAP. Additionally, Mr. Grossett fulfilled all of his obligations with regard to payment of the necessary fees for reinstatement.

Mr. Grossett has presented the Board with documentation showing compliance with the requirements of the 2010 Order, and currently is seeking to remove all restrictions from his license to practice pharmacy.

The Board having determined that Mr. Grossett is fully in compliance with the Order reinstating his license, such that the Board deems it appropriate to remove all restrictions previously placed on his license;

1. Kenneth W. Grossett, R.Ph., is hereby granted an unrestricted license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey.
