This matter was opened to the Board of Massage and Bodywork Therapy ("the Board") upon receipt of the application of Jamahl J. Marsh for licensure as a massage and bodywork therapist. Upon a review of the application and the criminal history background check, it was ascertained by the Board that the applicant had been arrested on September 23, 2011 for wandering to obtain a controlled dangerous substance in public, and there was an active warrant outstanding relating to that arrest. Mr. Marsh

has since resolved this matter, on September 30, 2013, pleading guilty to "creating a disturbance," with the imposition of a total of \$133.00 in fine/assessments. Respondent did not disclose the arrest on his application, claiming that he did not believe he had been arrested, was unaware of the outstanding bench warrant, and had believed the matter to have been resolved.

The Board finds that the respondent knew or should have known that he had failed to disclose the arrest on his application, and moreover finds the relatively recent nature of the conduct underlying the arrest troubling.

The Board further finds that granting the applicant's request for licensure is appropriate under the circumstances, in light of the fact that Mr. Marsh has never previously been arrested. Finding that the within order is sufficiently protective of the public health, safety and welfare, and for other good cause shown;

IT IS ON THIS 7th DAY OF February, 2014

HEREBY ORDERED AND AGREED THAT:

1. Mr. Marsh's application for licensure shall be granted upon his demonstration that he has satisfied licensure requirements and paid all applicable fees, if he has not already done so. Mr. Marsh shall be placed on probation for a period of

one year, dating from the filing of this Order. The conditions of probation are set forth below.

3. Mr. Marsh shall report to the Board within five (5) business days any arrest, indictment or conviction for any crime or disorderly persons offense.


4. Mr. Marsh shall obey all the laws of the State of New Jersey, the United States and their political subdivisions as well as all regulations, rules or laws pertaining to the practice of massage and bodywork therapy in the State or jurisdiction in which he practices massage and bodywork therapy.

5. Any deviation from the terms of this Order without the prior written consent of the Board shall constitute a failure to comply with the terms of this Order. Upon receipt of any reliable information indicating that the applicant has violated any term of this Order, Mr. Marsh's license may be automatically suspended by the Board. Mr. Marsh, upon notice, may request a hearing to contest the entry of such an order. At any such hearing, the sole issue shall be whether any of the information received regarding Mr. Marsh was materially false.

6. At the end of the term of probation, Mr. Marsh may petition the Board in writing for release from the terms of this Order. In the event that there have been no arrests or convictions during the period of probation, the Board may then grant such a

petition by means of a written communication, without need for further Order of the Board.
