This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Social Work Examiners ("Board") upon receipt of information revealing the following:

1. Respondent, Stacey M. Murphy, was initially registered to provide social work services as a Certified Social Worker in the State of New Jersey on January 5, 2009.
2. Respondent did not renew her registration prior to its expiration on August 31, 2010. Board records do not reflect any attempt to reinstate her registration to date.

3. Respondent's failure to submit her biennial renewal in New Jersey in 2010 resulting in a lapsed registration status provides grounds to automatically suspend Respondent's registration to practice as a Certified Social Worker in the State of New Jersey pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(b).

ACCORDINGLY, IT IS on this 12th day of February, 2014,
ORDERED THAT:

1. Respondent's registration to practice as a Certified Social Worker in the State of New Jersey shall be, and hereby is, suspended by operation of N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1, without a hearing. Any practice of social work during the period in which she does not hold an active registration shall be deemed the unregistered practice of social work and shall subject respondent to disciplinary action by the Board and referral for any other action permitted by law.

2. In the event that Respondent seeks reinstatement of her New Jersey registration at any time in the future, then this Order shall require Respondent to appear before a Committee of the New Jersey State Board of Social Work Examiners. At that inquiry, she will have to discuss the resolution of the criminal charges relating to her multiple arrests in 2010 and 2011, and provide evidence to the satisfaction of the Board that she is fit to engage in the practice of social work in New Jersey, and is not suffering from any impairment that would prevent her from providing social

work services with reasonable skill and safety. Additionally, the Board reserves the right to deny reinstatement, or, in the event reinstatement is granted, take disciplinary action and place restrictions and/or limitations upon Respondent's registration to provide social work services in the State of New Jersey.
