FINAL ORDER OF
DENIAL OF LICENSURE

TO PRACTICE MASSAGE AND
BODYWORK THERAPY IN THE
STATE OF NEW JERSEY

This matter was opened to the Board of Massage and Bodywork Therapy ("the Board") upon receipt of information which the Board has reviewed and the following findings of fact and conclusions of law are made:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Lanying Wang submitted an application for licensure to the Board.
2. On Ms. Wang's application, she disclosed an arrest for unlicensed practice of massage, and in her written explanation to the Board she also indicated that the arrest was for the unlicensed practice of massage.
3. Documents that Ms. Wang was asked to submit documenting the disposition of the arrest indicated that Ms. Wang was originally charged with prostitution on November 25, 2011, and that an undercover officer alleged that Ms. Wang had offered to engage

in sexual intercourse with him for \$140. Ms. Wang was conditionally discharged, the matter was ultimately dismissed and the records sealed.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Ms. Wang's characterization of the arrest as having resulted from the unlicensed practice of massage, when it was actually an arrest for engaging in prostitution, constitutes misrepresentation in violation of N.J.S.A. 45:11-21(b).

Based on the foregoing findings and conclusions, a Provisional Order of Denial of Licensure was entered on April 23, 2014, provisionally denying Ms. Wang's application for licensure. A copy of the Order was served upon the applicant by certified and regular mail at her address of record. The Provisional Order was subject to finalization by the Board at 5:00 p.m. on the 30th business day following entry unless Ms. Wang requested a modification or dismissal of the stated Findings of Fact or Conclusions of Law by submitting a written request for modification or dismissal setting forth in writing any and all reasons why said findings and conclusions should be modified or dismissed and submitting any and all documents or other written evidence supporting Ms. Wang's request for consideration and reasons therefor.

Although the record reflects that the certified mailing was returned, marked "attempted-not known, unable to forward," the regular mailing of the order was not returned. The Board

determined that service had been effected as the mailings had both been sent to the applicant's address of record with the Board. The Board further determined that as no discrepancies had been raised with respect to the findings and conclusions of the Provisional Order, additional proceedings were not necessary, and the Provisional Order should be made final.

ACCORDINGLY,


IT IS on this 23rd DAY of July, 2014,

1. Ms. Wang's application for licensure as a massage and bodywork therapist in the State of New Jersey is hereby denied. No subsequent application for licensure will be entertained for a period of two years, dating from the filing of this order.
