**INTERIM CONSENT ORDER OF
VOLUNTARY SURRENDER
OF LICENSE**

The New Jersey Fire Alarm, Burglar Alarm, and Locksmith Advisory Committee ("the Committee") received information that Michael L. Ardrey ("respondent"), was arrested on October 10, 2014 and charged with Endangering the Welfare of a Child by Knowingly Possessing and Viewing any Item which Depicts a Child Engaging in a Prohibited Sexual Act or in the Simulation of Such an Act (N.J.S.A. 2C:24-4b(5)(b)).

The parties have agreed to an interim order of voluntary surrender of respondent's license to engage in the burglar alarm business in the State of New Jersey pending resolution of the criminal charges and further order of the Committee. This order is entered without prejudice to respondent's ability to defend against the criminal charges.

Respondent making no admissions, and the Committee specifically reserving its right to take action against respondent based on the conduct underlying his arrest and other information available to it; and the Committee finding the terms of this consent order to be adequately protective of the public health, safety and welfare;

IT IS, therefore, on this 23rd day of October, 2014,
ORDERED THAT:

1 Respondent, Michael L. Ardrey, shall immediately surrender his individual license to engage in the burglar alarm business in the State of New Jersey until resolution of the criminal charges, and further order of the Committee.

2 Respondent shall immediately cease and desist from engaging in the burglar alarm business, in any capacity, including performing such services as an employee of a burglar alarm business, fire alarm business or locksmith business until resolution of the criminal charges, and further order of the Committee.

3 Prior to any consideration of an application for a restoration of his license, respondent shall:

a Appear before the Committee to discuss his readiness to reenter the practice of engaging in the burglar alarm business. At that time respondent shall be prepared to propose his plans for future practice in New Jersey.

b. Demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Committee that he is physically and psychologically fit and that he is capable of discharging the functions of a licensee in a manner consistent with the public's health, safety and welfare.

c. Provide the Committee with reports from each and every mental health professional (including but not limited to: psychologists, counselors, therapists, psychiatrists) who have participated in respondent's care and/or treatment or provided an evaluation of respondent from the present time until the application for reinstatement.

d Affirmatively establish his fitness, competence and capacity to re-enter the active practice of engaging in the burglar alarm business within New Jersey, including an accounting of all continuing education courses completed while his license was surrendered and during the triennial licensing period prior to the surrender of license.

e. Provide the Committee with a full account of his employment during the intervening period of time from the entry of this Order to the time of his appearance before the Committee pursuant to this Order.

4. The Committee may require respondent to submit to an independent psychiatric evaluation prior to considering reinstatement of license

5. Following review of all relevant documents submitted, the Committee, in its

sole discretion, will determine whether and under what conditions respondent may return to practice.


6. The parties hereby stipulate that entry of this Order is without prejudice to further action by this Committee or other agencies or law enforcement entities regarding respondent's conduct.
