

ORDER OF REINSTATEMENT
OF LICENSE AND
ORDER WITHDRAWAING
FINAL ORDER OF DISCIPLINE
FILED ON NOVEMBER 7, 2014

TO PRACTICE AS A
REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL NURSE
IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Nursing ("Board") upon receipt of respondent's petition for reinstatement of her nursing license. Ms. Freycinet's nursing

license had been suspended by means of a Final Order of Discipline filed on November 7, 2014, based upon a finding that that she had failed to timely complete required nursing continuing education for the June 1, 2011-May 31, 2013 licensing cycle, in violation of N.J.A.C. 13:37-5.3. In addition, the November 7, 2014 order imposed a reprimand for misrepresentation, in violation of N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(b), and a \$250 civil penalty for the violation of N.J.A.C. 13:37-5.3.

The Board finds that the reprimand was imposed in error; Ms. Freycinet had truthfully reported on her 2013 renewal application that she would fail to complete required nursing continuing education for the 2011-2013 licensing cycle by May 31, 2013. Moreover, on March 11, 2014, respondent had submitted to a Board staff member documentation of thirty (30) contact , hours of nursing continuing education, belatedly satisfying the 2011-2013 requirements, and had submitted payment of the \$250 civil penalty for the violation of N.J.A.C. 13:37-5.3. On May 23, 2014, an order was filed by the Board, memorializing the payment of the \$250.

Therefore, Ms. Freycinet's nursing license ought not to have been suspended, according to the terms of the Provisional Order of Discipline filed on August 15, 2014. The suspension of Ms. Freycinet's nursing license occurred because Ms. Freycinet

did not respond to the Provisional Order of Discipline filed in this matter.

The Board finding that suspension of respondent's nursing license and imposition of a reprimand by the Final Order of Discipline filed on November 7, 2014 were not warranted, that the violation of N.J.A.C. 13:37-5.3 was already addressed by an order of the Board, and that reinstatement of respondent's nursing license is appropriate, and for other good cause shown;

IT IS, ON THIS *22nd* DAY OF *December*, 2014

HEREBY ORDERED AND AGREED THAT:

1. Respondent's petition for reinstatement of her license to practice nursing in New Jersey is granted.
2. The Provisional Order of Discipline filed on August 15, 2014 and the Final Order of Discipline filed on November 7, 2014 and their findings and conclusions are vacated.
