

ORDER RESCINDING DISCIPLINE  
AND REINSTATING LICENSE

TO PRACTICE AS A  
REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL NURSE  
IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY

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This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Nursing ("Board") upon receipt of respondent's petition for reinstatement of her nursing license. Ms. Akinlabi's nursing license had been suspended pursuant to a Final Order of Discipline entered on May 4, 2015. It has since been ascertained

that the suspension and additional discipline imposed by the 2015 order were based upon an error that was not due to any fault of Ms. Akinlabi.

A Provisional Order of Discipline had been filed on February 12, 2015, provisionally suspending respondent's nursing license for failure to demonstrate completion of required nursing continuing education for the 2012-2014 licensing cycle. A reprimand was also provisionally imposed for misrepresentation on her 2014 renewal application as to the completion of required continuing education, as well as a civil penalty in the amount of \$250 for failure to timely complete required continuing education in violation of N.J.A.C. 13:37-5.3. No response to the Provisional Order was brought to the Board's attention, and the Provisional Order was subsequently finalized.

On May 12, 2015, respondent came to the Board offices and demonstrated, by means of a certified mail receipt signed for on March 13, 2015, that she had timely responded to the Provisional Order. Moreover, respondent submitted certificates of completion demonstrating that she had timely completed thirty-two (32) contact hours of qualifying nursing continuing education for the 2012-2014 licensing cycle. Therefore, respondent further demonstrated that she had not engaged in misrepresentation on her 2014 renewal application.

The Board finding that entry of the within order is plainly warranted by the underlying facts, and for other good cause shown;

IT IS, ON THIS 14<sup>th</sup> DAY OF May, 2015

HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. The Final Order of Discipline entered on May 4, 2015, including the findings of fact and conclusions of law set forth in the order, along with the penalties imposed, is hereby rescinded.
2. Respondent's nursing license is hereby reinstated, and any indication of discipline in her licensure history which relates to the Provisional Order of Discipline filed of February 12, 2015 or the Final Order of Discipline filed on May 4, 2015, shall be deemed erroneous and is rescinded.
