CONSENT ORDER

LICENSED TO PRACTICE PROFESSIONAL
COUNSELING IN
THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY

The New Jersey State Board of Marriage and Family Therapy Examiners, Professional Counselor Examiners Committee ("Committee") received information that Katherine Glick ("Ms. Glick" or "respondent"), had been arrested on August 16, 2013, in Holmdel, New Jersey, and charged with possession of marijuana and drug paraphernalia. On September 13, 2013, the possession of drug paraphernalia charge was dismissed; Ms. Glick was granted a conditional discharge and entered a one year

diversionary program. She completed that program and, on May 21, 2014, the charge was dismissed.

On November 21, 2014, respondent appeared with counsel, Jordan S. Goldsmith, Esq., at an investigative inquiry into the matter held by the Committee. She candidly discussed the circumstances related to her arrest and her use of marijuana. By letter dated January 15, 2015, Ms. Glick reiterated that she had learned from the experience and would not violate the law in the future.

Having reviewed the entire record, including the testimony of respondent at the investigative inquiry, it appears to the Committee that Ms. Glick engaged in acts that would constitute a crime or offense that relates adversely to the profession of professional counseling. These facts establish a basis for disciplinary action pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(f). It appearing that respondent desires to resolve this matter without recourse to formal proceedings, and that resolution of this matter by the terms of this consent order is appropriate, and for good cause shown:

IT IS ON THIS *7* DAY OF *June*, 2015,

HEREBY ORDERED AND AGREED THAT:

1. Katherine Glick is reprimanded for possession and use of an unlawful controlled dangerous substance and drug paraphernalia.
2. Respondent shall cease and desist from using unlawful psychoactive substances.
3. Failure to comply with any of the terms of this consent order may result in further disciplinary action.
