

ORDER OF REINSTATEMENT
AND COMMENCEMENT OF
PROBATION

TO PRACTICE NURSING IN THE
STATE OF NEW JERSEY

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Nursing ("Board") upon receipt of respondent's petition for reinstatement of license after a three month period of active suspension imposed pursuant to a consent order entered on February 6, 2015. The basis for the suspension was the Board's determination that, while serving as Director of Nursing for Practice Home Care Services, Inc. d/b/a Homewatch Caregivers, in Bridgewater, New Jersey, respondent engaged in multiple

violations of N.J.S.A. 45:11-23 and N.J.A.C. 13:37-6.2 and N.J.A.C. 13:37-14.3 by failing to ensure that the agency operated in a manner consistent with statutes and regulations (respondent was a minority co-owner of the agency); failing to formalize a Plan of Care for its clients; failing to ensure that aides were assigned to clients who required personal care were Certified Homemaker-Home Health Aides; failing to confirm and document that care provided did not exceed the scope of the delegated tasks and procedures; and/or failing to ensure that the delegated tasks were performed in a satisfactory manner.

Pursuant to the February 6, 2015 consent order, a two year period of suspension was imposed, with three months of the suspension to be actively served. The remaining twenty-one month period of suspension was to be stayed and served as a period of probation, provided that respondent demonstrated compliance with the terms and conditions of the consent order. These terms included respondent's payment of a civil penalty in the amount of \$5,000, and costs and fees in the amount of \$7,785.16. The costs and fees were to be stayed provided that respondent complied with the terms and conditions of the consent order and with the rules and regulations governing the practice of nursing in New Jersey. Respondent was also required to successfully complete a Board-approved course in ethics.

Respondent has paid the \$5,000 civil penalty imposed by the consent order, and completed a Board-approved nursing ethics course on June 1, 2015. Respondent has provided documentation indicating that she has severed her connection with Practice Home Services, and has demonstrated that as of February 6, 2015 she officially ceased to provide nursing services for the company.

Respondent having demonstrated compliance with the terms and conditions of the February 6, 2015 consent order and having completed the three month period of active suspension mandated by that order, and for other good cause shown;

IT IS, ON THIS 16th DAY OF June, 2015


HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. Respondent has completed the three month active suspension imposed by the February 6, 2015 consent order, and her license is hereby reinstated. Respondent shall henceforth commence the twenty-one month period of stayed suspension to be served as a period of probation, with credit toward the stayed suspension period to be granted for the suspension time served subsequent to May 6, 2015, when the three month period of active suspension was to have ended.

2. At the end of the probationary period, respondent may petition the Board for official termination of probation.
