

The Board finds that the allegations, if proven, would demonstrate that the respondent has engaged in acts constituting crimes relating adversely to the practice of psychology, providing a basis for discipline against his license pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(f). Respondent denies the allegation and further denies any violation or basis for discipline under N.J.S.A. 45: 21(f) or under any applicable statute, regulation and/or law.

The parties being desirous of resolving this matter on an interim basis, and the Board being satisfied that good cause exists to support entry of the within Order:

IT IS on this 7th day of August 2015,

ORDERED AND AGREED that:

1. The license of Justin Miller, Ph.D. to practice psychology is hereby voluntarily surrendered to be deemed a temporary suspension pending the final resolution of all criminal charges against him and further Order of the Board, effective immediately.

2. Respondent shall cease and desist from advertising, offering to engage in or engaging in the practice of psychology in any setting, including exempt settings as defined by N.J.S.A. 45:14B-6, until resolution of the criminal charges. Respondent also agrees not to engage in practice as nor apply for licensure as a mental health professional in any other state or jurisdiction until disposition of the criminal charges.

3. Respondent shall return his original wall certificate, wallet certificate, and the most recent renewal card of his license to the Executive Director of the Board by mailing them to J. Michael Walker, Executive Director, Board of Psychological

Examiners, P. O. Box 45017, Newark, New Jersey 07101, contemporaneously with the signing of this Order.

4. This Order shall not preclude the Board from initiating disciplinary action based upon the conduct relating to respondent as alleged above or any conviction relating to such conduct. The entry of the within Order is without prejudice to the further investigation and/or prosecution of any violations by respondent of any statutes or regulations governing the practice of psychology or any mental health profession in this state or any other violations of the law, by the Board, the Attorney General, or any other regulatory or law enforcement agency, including but not limited to any matters under pending investigation.

5. Nothing contained herein shall be deemed an admission of criminal, civil and or administrative liability or any liability on the part of the respondent.

6. Prior to any application for reinstatement of his license as a psychologist, respondent shall provide the Board with an evaluation from an independent licensed psychologist or mental health professional or program pre-approved by the Board, indicating that respondent is able to practice the profession with reasonable skill and safety. The Board will review any application for reinstatement on its next available agenda to determine whether to grant reinstatement of respondent's license, and if granted, what conditions, if any, should be imposed on his practice of psychology.

7. Any practice in this State in violation of the above conditions shall constitute unlicensed practice and/or grounds for discipline for violation of an Order of the Board as well as professional misconduct.
