Re: Offer of Settlement In Lieu of Filing a Formal Disciplinary Complaint

Dear Ms. Chang:

This letter is to advise you that the New Jersey State Board of Physical Therapy Examiners (the "Board") has had an opportunity to review information provided with the application for reinstatement of your license to practice physical therapy in the State of New Jersey which was originally issued to you on February 18, 2008. Specifically, the information reviewed included the reinstatement application that indicated that your license was to be renewed on January 31, 2014 or within thirty (30) days of that date. You acknowledged in a notarized affidavit that you continued to work as a physical therapist at Professional Physical Therapy and Training, LLC located in Madison, New Jersey, a private physical therapy facility for the period from January 31, 2014 through June 1, 2015. Your employment status was also confirmed by correspondence from Matthew Riordan, PT who confirmed that you were employed in his physical therapy practice from August 2011 until approximately June 1, 2015 when you were temporarily suspended from treating patients until your license to engage in the practice of physical therapy was reinstated.

The Board has preliminarily concluded that probable cause exists to support a finding that you violated N.J.S.A. 45:1-7.1(b) and (c) in that you failed to renew your license within thirty days of the January 31, 2014 renewal period and you continued to practice with a suspended license for approximately 16 months from March 1, 2014 through June 1, 2015.

At this juncture, the Board has preliminarily concluded that the above violations are sufficient to warrant the initiation of formal disciplinary proceedings against you. Notwithstanding that decision, however, the Board has determined that it will first offer you an opportunity to settle this matter, and thereby avoid the initiation of disciplinary proceedings, should you consent to:

1. Cease and desist in the future from continuing to practice physical therapy without a valid current license.

2. Pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$1500.00 for continuing to engage in the practice of physical therapy while your license was suspended (to be paid immediately upon your signing of the acknowledgment at the bottom of this letter by sending a certified check or money order payable to the Board of Physical Therapy Examiners attention Lisa Tadeo, P.O. Box 45012, Newark, New Jersey 07101).


If you are willing to settle this matter on the offered settlement terms, you may do so by signing the acknowledgment at the bottom of this letter, and returning it to the Board office. Upon your signature, this letter will be a matter of public record.

In the event you are unwilling to settle this matter on the offered terms, it will be referred to the Attorney General's office for the initiation of appropriate enforcement action. In such event, you will be afforded an opportunity to defend against the alleged violations. If an evidentiary hearing is deemed warranted the Board will either conduct that hearing at a date and time to be scheduled or refer the matter to the Office of Administrative Law. You are advised, however, that in the event formal charges are filed, the Board may assess civil penalties in an amount greater than that herein offered in settlement should any charges against you be sustained. Additionally, the Board may, if the facts are found to so warrant, enter an order, requiring you to reimburse certain monies and/or requiring you to pay costs incurred by the Board. If you elect to settle this matter presently, you should sign the acknowledgment at the bottom of this letter and return it to the Board within fifteen (15) days following your receipt of this letter. In the event that the Board receives no response from you within fifteen (15) days, the Board's settlement offer will be withdrawn, and the matter will be referred to the Attorney General's Office for the initiation of appropriate enforcement proceedings.


