

**Custom Meds Compounding Pharmacy**  
**Registration No. 28R000045800**

Consent Order

TO OPERATE AS AN "OUT-OF-STATE"  
PHARMACY PURSUANT TO  
N.J.A.C. 13:39-4.19

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This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy ("Board") upon receipt of information that Custom Meds Compounding Pharmacy, a pharmacy located at 102 E. Highland Blvd, Inverness, FL had entered into a settlement agreement with the Florida Board of Pharmacy. Custom Meds Compounding Pharmacy holds a New Jersey out-of-state registration authorizing them to ship into New Jersey. Pursuant to the Florida agreement, Custom Meds' Florida permit to

operate as a pharmacy was placed on probation for a minimum period of two years following allegations that Custom Meds dispensed 360 capsules of domperidone 10mg to patient R.F. in violation of federal and Florida state laws. Domperidone is not a drug approved by the United States Food and Drug Administration and is not an active ingredient contained in any FDA-approved drug. New Jersey Board of Pharmacy regulations also prohibit the dispensing of drugs or medicine without appropriate approval from the FDA. N.J.A.C. 13:39-7.5.

The parties, having agreed to resolution of this matter without further formal proceedings, and Custom Meds Compounding Pharmacy, having agreed and given voluntary consent to the within order and waiving any right to a hearing, and the Board finding the within disposition adequately protective of the public health, safety, and welfare, and other good cause having been shown;

**IT IS THEREFORE** on this 10<sup>th</sup> day of September 2015,

**ORDERED AND AGREED that:**

1. The New Jersey out-of-state registration issued to Custom Meds Compounding Pharmacy is placed on probation for a minimum of two years, effective retroactively to April 23, 2015, the date its Florida permit was placed on probation. Custom Meds Compounding Pharmacy may apply for termination of the probationary period only upon termination of the probation placed on its permit in the State of Florida.

2. During the period of probation, Custom Meds Compounding Pharmacy will notify the New Jersey Board of Pharmacy within 10 days of any changes to the status of its permit to operate a pharmacy in Florida.

3. During the period of probation, Custom Meds Compounding Pharmacy will notify the New Jersey Board of Pharmacy within 10 days of receiving notice that they are the subject of any investigation or complaint alleging violations of any law in any State.

3. Custom Meds Compounding Pharmacy agrees that it shall not ship domperidone, or any other drug that is not FDA-approved, into the State of New Jersey.
