

CONSENT ORDER

TO PRACTICE PHARMACY IN THE
STATE OF NEW JERSEY

This matter was opened to the New Jersey Board of Pharmacy ("the Board") upon receipt of reports of inspection of the facility at Wedgewood Village Pharmacy, Inc. ("Wedgewood") which occurred on November 14 and 15, 2012. The reports document potential violations of the Board's regulations regarding sterile compounding. Wedgewood engages in high risk sterile compounding. At all relevant times, Anthony Grzib, RP ("Respondent") was the Registered Pharmacist-in-Charge ("RPIC") of Wedgewood.

Among other things, the inspection reports highlighted routine professional practices suggesting that thousands of

units of medication were dispensed with disregard for the following regulatory requirements:

- Use-by dates exceed 30 days after preparation in violation of N.J.A.C. 13:39-11.11.
- Failure to include date and time of preparation on prescription labels in violation of N.J.A.C. 13:39-11.10(a)(1).
- Failure to include the use-by date and use-by time on prescription labels as required by N.J.A.C. 13:39-11.10(a)(7).

The Board finds that the violations, if proven, which occurred while Respondent bore responsibility as the RPIC, may have created risks to the public. N.J.A.C. 13:39-11.5(a) and 13:39-6.2 define the responsibilities of the RPIC to ensure a safe environment and the adequacy of procedures for compounding of sterile product.

No evidence of contamination was found during the inspections. Respondent has been fully cooperative with the Board's investigation and has made efforts at bringing the pharmacy into compliance with New Jersey statutes and regulations and with the USP guidelines.

The parties, having agreed to resolution of this matter without formal proceedings, and Respondent, having agreed and given voluntary consent to the within order and waiving any right to a hearing, and the Board finding the within disposition adequately protective of the public health, safety, and welfare, and other good cause having been shown;

IT IS THEREFORE on this 22nd day of OCTOBER, 2015,
ORDERED AND AGREED that

1. Respondent's license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey will be placed on probation for a period of 24 months from November 1, 2015 through October 31, 2017.

2. During the period of probation, Respondent shall not serve as an RPIC, a preceptor, have any ownership interest in any pharmacy in the State of New Jersey, or engage in sterile compounding in the State of New Jersey.

3. Respondent shall pay a civil penalty in the amount of \$10,000 to the Board for the violations indicated above which occurred while he served as RPIC at Wedgewood Village Pharmacy, Inc. Payment will be due in twelve monthly installments beginning November 1, 2015 in the amount of \$833 due on the first day of every month for eleven months and in the amount of \$837 for the twelfth and final payment. Payment shall be made by bank check, money order, wire transfer or credit card payable to the New Jersey Board of Pharmacy and mailed to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy, ATTN: Anthony Rubinaccio, Executive Director, 124 Halsey Street, P.O. Box 45013, Newark, New Jersey 07101. Any other form of payment will be rejected and will be returned to the party making the payment. In the event that respondent fails to make timely payment, interest shall begin to accrue at the annual court rule rate, a Certification of Debt


shall be issued, and the Board may institute such other proceedings as are authorized by law.

4. On or before February 1, 2016, Respondent shall provide documentation of his successful completion of twelve continuing education credits, including one course each in recordkeeping, ethics, and sterile compounding procedures. The courses must be pre-approved by the Board and may not be counted towards the continuing education credits required for license renewal. Successful completion means that all sessions were attended, all assignments were properly and appropriately completed, and a passing grade was achieved which was unconditional and without reservation.


