This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Nursing (“Board”) upon receipt of Jesse Wayne Collier’s application for licensure as a Registered Nurse (RN) by endorsement, including voluntary consent to a criminal history background check. Upon review of the results of the criminal history background check, the Board ascertained that the applicant was arrested on September 28, 1996 by the Seymour, Texas Sheriff’s Office and charged with Forgery Financial Instrument (Equivalent to N.J.S.A. 2C:21-1, Forgery & Related Offenses) and Burglary of Habitation (Equivalent to N.J.S.A. 2C:18-2, Burglary).

The applicant failed to disclose this arrest on his application for licensure, answering “No” to the question on the license application which asked if he had ever been arrested and “No” to the question which asked if he had ever been found guilty of any offense. The applicant stated he

checked “no” because he thought the matter was expunged and he, therefore could answer “no” to the question whether he had been arrested.

The applicant now acknowledges this arrest and provided a copy of the disposition.

The Board finds that the applicant misrepresented his criminal history on the application, which constitutes a violation of N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(b).

The Board having reviewed this matter, and having considered the nature and timing of the above conduct, and the parties desiring to resolve this matter, and the Board having determined that the within Order is sufficiently protective of the public, in lieu of further proceedings, and for other good cause shown;

IT IS on this 23rd day of November, 2015

HEREBY ORDERED AND AGREED that:

1. Jesse Collier’s application for licensure as a Registered Nurse by endorsement shall be granted upon Board review and approval of a completed application and compliance with paragraph two below.

2. A civil penalty in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) is hereby imposed upon the applicant for failing to disclose his arrest on his application. Payment shall be made by certified check, bank cashier check, or money order payable to “State of New Jersey,” or by wire transfer, direct deposit, or credit card payment submitted contemporaneously with this signed Order. Any other form of payment will be rejected and will be returned to the party making the payment.


3. The applicant shall obey all the laws of the State of New Jersey, the United States

and their political subdivisions, as well as all regulations, rules or laws pertaining to the practice of nursing in any State or jurisdiction in which he practices nursing.
