

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Medical Examiners ("Board") upon receipt of information that on or about July 10, 2014, the Medical Board of California ("California Board") entered a "Decision and Order" which adopted a "Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order" at which time the Respondent's medical license was revoked but entirely stayed. Respondent was placed on probation for five (5) years with certain terms and conditions, including, a prohibition of prescribing any Schedule II and Schedule III controlled dangerous substances ("CDS"), with the exception of

Adderall and Testosterone, the completion of various Continuing Education courses and implementation of a practice monitor.

The Respondent agreed in the Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order that at an Administrative Hearing, a prima facie case could be established with respect to the charges and allegations against him contained in the "Accusation", namely, gross negligence, repeated acts of negligence, prescribing CDS without an exam or medical indication, excessive prescribing, inadequate records, and prescribing CDS to a patient with a Vicodin addiction.

As a result of the foregoing, the Board has determined that Respondent's acts giving rise to the California disciplinary action provide a basis to take disciplinary action against Respondent's New Jersey license to practice medicine and surgery pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(c) (gross negligence), N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(d) (repeated acts of negligence), N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(e) (professional or occupational misconduct), N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(g) (has had authority to engage in the activity regulated by the Board revoked or suspended by another other state), N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(h) (has violated or failed to comply with the provisions of any act or regulation administered by the Board), and N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(m) (indiscriminate prescribing).

IT IS NOW APPEARING that the parties wish to resolve this matter without recourse to formal proceedings; and that Respondent hereby waives any right to a hearing in this matter; and the Board finding

that the within Order adequately protects the public's health, safety, and welfare; and for good cause shown;

IT IS ON THIS 10th day of DECEMBER, 2015, ORDERED AND AGREED THAT:

1. Respondent's license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of New Jersey shall be, and hereby is suspended for five years, to be stayed in its entirety and served as probation commencing and consistent with the initiation of the probationary period as set forth in the California Decision and Order, but which probationary period shall not terminate until Respondent demonstrates to the Board's satisfaction that the probationary period in California has successfully terminated;

2. Prior to any active practice of medicine and surgery in New Jersey, the Respondent shall notify the Board and be required to appear before the Board or a Committee thereof to demonstrate: (1) fitness to practice medicine in New Jersey; and (2) that he holds an active unrestricted license to practice medicine and surgery in California.


3. Respondent agrees that if the Board, upon receipt of reliable information and in its sole discretion, determines during the probationary period that the Respondent has failed to comply with any provisions of the California Order, or is in violation of any of this Board's statutes and/or regulations, then the period of stayed suspension provided above shall be activated and

Respondent's New Jersey license to practice medicine and surgery shall be automatically and immediately suspended without a hearing, in addition to any other limitations or restrictions as the Board deems appropriate. Within five (5) days of notification of the suspension, Respondent may provide a written request for a hearing before a Committee of the Board limited to the sole issue of whether a violation of this Consent Order has occurred; and

4. Respondent shall comply with the Directives Regarding Licensees who have been disciplined, which are attached hereto and made a part hereof.



NOTICE OF REPORTING PRACTICES OF BOARD
REGARDING DISCIPLINARY ACTIONS

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-3(3), all orders of the New Jersey State Board of Medical Examiners are available for public inspection. Should any inquiry be made concerning the status of a licensee, the inquirer will be informed of the existence of the order and a copy will be provided if requested. All evidentiary hearings, proceedings on motions or other applications which are conducted as public hearings and the record, including the transcript and documents marked in evidence, are available for public inspection, upon request.

Pursuant to 45 CFR Subtitle A 60.8, the Board is obligated to report to the National Practitioners Data Bank any action relating to a physician which is based on reasons relating to professional competence or professional conduct:

- (1) Which revokes or suspends (or otherwise restricts) a license,
- (2) Which censures, reprimands or places on probation,
- (3) Under which a license is surrendered.

Pursuant to 45 CFR Section 61.7, the Board is obligated to report to the Healthcare Integrity and Protection (HIP) Data Bank, any formal or official actions, such as revocation or suspension of a license (and the length of any such suspension), reprimand, censure or probation or any other loss of license or the right to apply for, or renew, a license of the provider, supplier, or practitioner, whether by operation of law, voluntary surrender, non-renewability, or otherwise, or any other negative action or finding by such Federal or State agency that is publicly available information.

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:9-19.13, if the Board refuses to issue, suspends, revokes or otherwise places conditions on a license or permit, it is obligated to notify each licensed health care facility and health maintenance organization with which a licensee is affiliated and every other board licensee in this state with whom he or she is directly associated in private medical practice.

In accordance with an agreement with the Federation of State Medical Boards of the United States, a list of all disciplinary orders are provided to that organization on a monthly basis.

Within the month following entry of an order, a summary of the order will appear on the public agenda for the next monthly Board meeting and is forwarded to those members of the public requesting

a copy. In addition, the same summary will appear in the minutes of that Board meeting, which are also made available to those requesting a copy.

Within the month following entry of an order, a summary of the order will appear in a Monthly Disciplinary Action Listing which is made available to those members of the public requesting a copy.

On a periodic basis the Board disseminates to its licensees a newsletter which includes a brief description of all of the orders entered by the Board.

From time to time, the Press Office of the Division of Consumer Affairs may issue releases including the summaries of the content of public orders.

Nothing herein is intended in any way to limit the Board, the Division or the Attorney General from disclosing any public document.
