**FINAL CONSENT ORDER**

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Nursing (the "Board") upon receipt of information indicating that on or about January 16, 2016, Inna Moldaver, C.H.H.A. ("Respondent"), holder of certificate number **26NH08380800** to practice homemaker-home health aide services, pled guilty to a one-count Accusation charging third-degree Health Care Claims Fraud, in violation of N.J.S.A. 2C:21-4.3. Pursuant to the plea agreement, Respondent will serve a non-custodial term of probation for one (1) year, and must pay restitution in the amount of \$3,000 and perform forty (40) hours of community service during the term of probation. The charges in the Accusation relate

to Respondent's performance of homemaker-home health aide services during January 2013. Respondent's certificate expired on November 30, 2015 and has not been renewed.

Respondent's conduct, as evidenced by her guilty plea, constitutes sufficient grounds for disciplinary action against her certificate to practice as a certified Homemaker-Home Health Aide in New Jersey, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(b) in that Respondent has engaged in the use or employment of dishonesty, N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(f) in that Respondent pled guilty to a crime relating adversely to the activity regulated by the Board, and N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(k) in that Respondent violated an insurance fraud prevention law.

The parties, the Acting Attorney General and Respondent, Inna Moldaver, desire to resolve this matter without formal proceedings; Respondent voluntarily consents to the within Order and waives any right to a hearing in this matter; and the Board, finding the within disposition adequately protective of the public health, safety and welfare, and other good cause having been shown:

**IT IS ON THIS 17 day of February 2016, HEREBY ORDERED AND AGREED THAT:**

1. Respondent's certificate to practice as a certified Homemaker-Home Health Aide in New Jersey is hereby suspended, effective immediately. Respondent shall not be eligible to apply for or obtain reinstatement of her certificate to practice homemaker-home health aide services in the State of New Jersey for a period of four (4) years. This period of active suspension will be tolled for any length of time that Respondent practices as a homemaker-health aide in another jurisdiction.

2. Respondent shall cease and desist from holding herself out as a Certified Homemaker-Home Health Aide and/or practicing as a certified homemaker-home health aide, which includes, but is not limited to, performing delegated nursing regimens or nursing tasks delegated through the authority of a duly licensed professional nurse in the State of New Jersey. Any practice by Respondent constitutes grounds for a charge of unlicensed practice pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-25.

3. Respondent shall immediately surrender her most recent certificate to practice as a certified homemaker-home health aide, and any biennial registration cards, to the Board by submitting the same, together with this signed Order, to the New Jersey Board of Nursing, Attention: Joanne Leone, Acting Executive Director, at 124 Halsey Street, Sixth Floor, Newark, New Jersey, 07101.

4. Prior to Board consideration of any application by Respondent for reinstatement of her certificate to practice homemaker-home health aide services in New Jersey, Respondent shall appear before the Board to provide evidence of her rehabilitation to the satisfaction of the Board, including completion of all probationary terms and conditions, and to show competency to practice as a certified Homemaker-Home Health Aide in New Jersey, including documentation of satisfactory completion of a homemaker-home health aide training course as required by Board regulations. If reinstatement is granted, Respondent agrees to provide a copy of this Final Consent Order and the Reinstatement Order to all future employers.


5. Respondent is assessed an administrative penalty in the amount of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) which shall be stayed until Respondent applies for reinstatement. Upon Respondent's application for reinstatement, payment shall be

made in the form of bank check, money order, certified check or credit card. Payment rendered in any other form will be rejected and deemed unremitted. All payments shall be forwarded to the attention of the Executive Director, New Jersey Board of Nursing, 124 Halsey Street, Sixth Floor, Newark, New Jersey, 07101.

6. The parties hereby stipulate that entry of this Order is without prejudice to further action or investigation by this Board, the Acting Attorney General, the Director of the Division of Consumer Affairs, or any other law enforcement entities, resulting from Respondent's conduct prior or subsequent to the entry of this Order.
