

would have "completed the required continuing education credits by May 31, 2015," referring to the biennial renewal period of June 1, 2013 to May 31, 2015. Respondent answered "Yes" and certified that answer by submitting the online application. Respondent also answered "Yes" to the question which asked whether Respondent completed the required one hour course on Organ and Tissue Donation.

3. The Board sent a letter of inquiry requesting, in part, documentation of completed continuing education to Respondent's address of record in Ewing], New Jersey, via regular and certified mail on or about June 2, 2015. The regular mailing was not returned. The receipt of the certified mailing was signed upon delivery on June 15, 2015.

4. Respondent failed to provide documentation of continuing education.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:37-5.3(b), nurses are required to complete a minimum of thirty (30) hours of continuing education during the preceding biennial period in order to renew their licenses. By February 7, 2014, every Registered Professional Nurse was required to complete a one hour course on organ and tissue donation in accordance with N.J.A.C. 13:37-5.3(j). Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:37-5.3(f), nurses are required to

maintain documentation of completion of continuing education for a period of four years after completion, and shall submit such documentation to the Board upon request.

Respondent failed to demonstrate, to the satisfaction of the Board, that Respondent completed the continuing education credits required for renewal during the biennial period of June 1, 2013 to May 31, 2015. The Board therefore finds Respondent in violation of N.J.A.C. 13:37-5.3(b) and 13:37-5.3(f), which in turn subjects Respondent to sanctions pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(e) and (h).

Respondent's misrepresentation during the license renewal process in the continuing education information constitutes a violation of N.J.S.A. 45:1-21(b), subjecting Respondent to sanctions.

Based on the foregoing findings and conclusions, a Provisional Order of Discipline suspending respondent's license to practice nursing in the state of New Jersey was entered on November 9, 2015 and a copy served on respondent. The provisional Order was subject to finalization by the Board at 5:00 pm on the 30th business day following entry unless respondent requested a modification or dismissal of the stated Findings of Fact or Conclusions of Law by submitting a written request for modification or dismissal setting forth in writing

any and all reasons why said findings and conclusions should be modified or dismissed and submitting any and all documents or other written evidence supporting respondent's request for consideration and reasons therefor.

Respondent responded to the Order and provided a check for \$250.00, and proof of successful completion of 30 hours of continuing education that were completed on November 17, 2015, that will applied to cure the deficiency of the 2013-2015 renewal period. Respondent's submissions were reviewed by the Board, and the Board determined that further proceedings were not necessary and that the material discrepancies had been raised. The board was not persuaded that the submitted material merited further consideration, as respondent did not dispute the Findings of Fact or Conclusions of Law.


**ACCORDINGLY, IT IS on this 9th day of May, 2016,
ORDERED that matter:**

1. A reprimand is imposed for misrepresenting the continuing education information on the license renewal application.

2. Respondent is assessed a civil penalty in the amount of two hundred and fifty dollars (\$250) for failing to timely complete required continuing education.
