

TO PRACTICE AS A PHARMACIST	:	
IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY	:	

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy ("Board") upon receipt of the petition of Hamid Rahimtoola, R.Ph. ("Respondent") for reinstatement of his license to practice pharmacy.

Respondent's license had been administratively suspended for non-renewal in 1997. In 1997, he received a Masters in Clinical Pharmacy with honours from the University Strathclyde located in the United Kingdom and in 2003, he received a

Doctorate in Farmacoepidemiology from the University of Utrecht located in the Netherlands. Since 1997, Respondent has worked as a Project Manager with the SIR Institute of Pharmacy Practice and Policy located in the Netherlands, and as a Pharmacy Manager in at least three pharmacies located in the Netherlands. Most recently, Respondent has been working as a Pharmacy Manager at the Proclinic Pharmacy de Droge - TweeSteden ziekenhui (Two City Hospital) located in the Netherlands.

Respondent has not engaged in the practice of pharmacy in New Jersey, or even the United States, for approximately twenty years. The Board is acutely aware of its responsibility to protect the public's health, safety, and welfare. Therefore, Respondent will be required to show competency in the practice of pharmacy prior to reinstatement pursuant to the standards all New Jersey licensees are held to. However, Respondent's situation is unique in that he has considerable training and experience as a pharmacist in Europe. Accordingly, in lieu of taking and passing the North American Pharmacist Licensure Examination ("NAPLEX"), Respondent may opt to engage in a Board-approved plan of remediation following completion of the Pharmacist Assessment for Remediation Evaluation ("PARE").

The parties, having agreed to resolution of this matter without formal proceedings, and Respondent, having agreed and given his voluntary consent to the within order and waiving any

right to a hearing, and the Board finding the within disposition adequately protective of the public health, safety, and welfare, and other good cause having been shown;

IT IS, therefore on this 7th **day of** July, 2016

ORDERED THAT:

1. Respondent's license to practice pharmacy in the State of New Jersey shall be reinstated following his completion of the terms of this Order. Prior to reinstatement, Respondent shall :
 - a. Complete the North American Pharmacist Licensure Examination ("NAPLEX") with a minimum passing score of 75 or the Pharmacist Assessment for Remediation Evaluation (PARE) exam. If Respondent chooses to take the PARE, Respondent must submit a written professional development plan to the Board, of how he intends to ameliorate any weaknesses identified by the results of the PARE exam. The plan should be submitted to the Board for review and approval within 30 days after Respondent receives the results of the PARE from the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy ("NABP"). This plan can include, but is not limited to, continuing education ("CE") courses and on the job training;
 - b. Complete the Multistate Pharmacy Jurisprudence Evaluation ("MPJE") with minimum passing score of 75.
 - c. Submit to the Board proof of successful completion of a 200-hour internship under the supervision of a Board approved preceptor who is aware of Respondent's history as outlined in


this Order. The preceptor shall sign a copy of this Order indicating his agreement to supervise Respondent and report to the Board as required by this Order. The Preceptor shall further agree to submit documentation to the Board at the conclusion of Respondent's internship indicating whether Respondent has successfully completed the internship. Successful completion means that his preceptor recommends unconditionally and without reservation that Respondent may safely and competently practice pharmacy without supervision.
