

Consent Order

TO OPERATE AS AN AOUT-OF-STATE@
PHARMACY PURSUANT TO
N.J.A.C. 13:39-4.19

This matter was opened to the New Jersey State Board of Pharmacy ("Board") upon receipt of information that Precision Pharmacy, located at 5301 Young Street, Bakersfield, CA, had entered into a settlement agreement with the California Board of Pharmacy. Precision Pharmacy holds a New Jersey out-of-state registration authorizing them to ship prescription medication into New Jersey. On or about September 1, 2009, the California Board conducted an inspection which resulted in numerous allegations of regulatory violations: acting as a manufacturer and wholesaler

without appropriate licenses; violating a Cease and Desist Order issued by the Food and Drug Administration; failing to maintain proper records and paperwork; and improperly filling prescriptions. Without admitting or proving the allegations, Precision and the California Board of Pharmacy entered into a settlement agreement to resolve the Accusation.

Pursuant to the California agreement, Precision's California pharmacy permit and sterile compounding license were revoked. However, the revocations were stayed, and Precision Pharmacy was placed on probation for three (3) years with the requirement that it satisfy all terms set forth in the California order, some of which include: obeying all state and federal laws and regulations, reporting to the California Board on a quarterly basis, submitting to interviews with the California Board, cooperating with Board staff, and reimbursing the Board the costs of investigation and prosecution in the amount of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00).

Precision Pharmacy has also entered into settlement agreements regarding the abovementioned violations with at least ten (10) other States: Louisiana, Oregon, Colorado, Iowa, Michigan, Nevada, Alabama, South Carolina, Texas, and Missouri.

The parties, having agreed to resolution of this matter without further formal proceedings, and Precision Pharmacy, having agreed and given voluntary consent to the within order and waiving

any right to a hearing, and the Board finding the within disposition adequately protective of the public health, safety, and welfare, and other good cause having been shown;

IT IS THEREFORE on this 18th day of August, 2016,

ORDERED AND AGREED that:

1. The New Jersey out-of-state registration issued to Precision Pharmacy is hereby suspended. However, the suspension is stayed, and Precision Pharmacy is placed on probation for a minimum of three (3) years, effective retroactively to February 11, 2014, the date its California permit was placed on probation. Precision Pharmacy may apply for termination of the probationary period only upon termination of the probation placed on its permit in the State of California.

2. During the period of probation, Precision Pharmacy will notify the New Jersey Board of Pharmacy within 10 days of any changes to the status of its permit to operate a pharmacy in California.

3. During the period of probation, Precision Pharmacy will notify the New Jersey Board of Pharmacy no later than 10 days after receiving notice that they are the subject of any investigation or complaint alleging violations of any law in any State.
