This matter was opened to the State Board of Mortuary Science ("Board") upon receipt of an intern registration application by Jeremy Simpson. Mr. Simpson reported that he had a criminal history specifically that in 2006, he pled guilty to armed robbery and served six years in prison.

The Respondent appeared and testified at an investigative inquiry before the Board on June 7, 2016 to discuss his criminal history and application for an intern registration. The Board was previously provided with his criminal history record, including the Judgment of Conviction and arrest report. The Board also reviewed

a parole officer's letter of recommendation for Mr. Simpson, which indicated that Respondent has been compliant with all aspects of parole.

Respondent was sixteen years old when he was arrested for armed robbery and eighteen years old when he pled guilty. During the investigative inquiry, Respondent expressed remorse and responsibility for his criminal activity. Mr. Simpson is currently on parole with an expected completion date in August 2018. He is meeting all conditions of parole, which includes maintaining employment, undergoing urine screens for illicit substances, and refraining from any criminal activity.

Mr. Simpson testified that he is currently working full-time at a funeral home and would like to pursue a career in mortuary science. Mr. Simpson has completed three semesters of college and anticipates enrolling at Eastwick Mortuary Science program to obtain his degree.

The Board having considered the factors enumerated in the New Jersey Rehabilitated Convicted Offenders Act, N.J.S.A. 2A:168A-1 et. seq., such as his young age at the time of the offense, the circumstances around the criminal conduct, and exemplary conduct since his release from prison, and it now appearing that Mr. Simpson desires to resolve this matter without recourse to formal proceedings; that he waives any right to a hearing; and that the within resolution is adequately protective of the public health,

safety, and welfare and for good cause shown;

IT IS, therefore, on this 22nd day of August, 2016,
HEREBY ORDERED AND AGREED THAT:


1. Mr. Simpson shall be granted an intern registration and comply with all statutes and regulations pertaining to his intern registration.

2. Mr. Simpson shall continue to comply with the conditions of his parole. He shall immediately advise the Board, in writing, if he is found by the New Jersey Parole Board to be non-compliant with the conditions of his parole and/or if he is arrested or convicted for any offense. For purposes of this Order, immediately shall mean within 72 hours.

3. Following discharge from parole, whether due to successful completion of parole or a violation of parole, Mr. Simpson shall ensure that his parole officer provide the Board with a report, which shall detail his compliance with parole.

4. Failure to comply with any term of the Order may result in immediate disciplinary action.




