II OPEN PUBLIC MEETINGS ACT

The statement required by Chapter 231, public laws of 1975, the "Open Public Meetings Act," was read and it was announced that notice of this meeting was prepared in the office of the Board of Architects and mailed to the Secretary of State, the Newark Star-Ledger, the Trenton Times, the Camden Courier-Post, the Record and the Atlantic City Press.

III APPROVAL OF MINUTES

January 27, 2005

ACTION: Mr. Whang motioned to approve the minutes as presented. Mr. Zaccone seconded the motion. It passed unanimously.

IV ANNOUNCEMENTS

Mr. DeMassi announced that he and Mr. Whang will be attending the NCARB Joint Regional Meeting to be held in Milwaukee, Wisconsin on March 10 thru 12, 2005.

Mr. Zaccone announced that he will be attending the IDP Coordinator meeting in Washington DC on February 12 & 13, 2005.

At the April 7, 2005 meeting, Mr. Garcia has arranged for a 45-minute power point presentation on electronic signatures with a 45-minute question and answer session.

V OLD BUSINESS

On January 13th, the Board reviewed a letter from Lea Ann Sluss, Office Manager of Interior Design Associates, Inc. (IDA), requesting whether an architect's seal would be required for interior design work, as listed in the letter, that IDA will perform for the project of Luxury Condominium Tower in North Bergen. The Board unanimously voted to forward this correspondence to the Interior Design Committee for review and action.

The Interior Design Committee met on February 2, 2005 and reviewed the above letter from Lea Ann Sluss. The Committee recommended that a letter be sent to Ms. Sluss advising that based on the information provided, the list does appear to be within the scope of interior design services. However, she should check with the local construction official. A copy of the interior design services definition from the statutes as well as a copy of the definition of architectural services from the statute should be included for her information.

ACTION: After some discussion, Mr. Zaccone motioned to send a letter advising that based on the information provided, the list does appear to be within the scope of interior design services. Also there is a difference between providing these services in the common areas, which may be the practice of architecture, as opposed to within the unit, which would be considered interior design services. Enclose a copy of both statutes for her information. Ms. Goté seconded the motion. Mr. Kellenyi abstained. Motion passed.
