**III. New Business**

**A. Assembly Bill 4094, Permits administration of epinephrine auto-injector device by persons who complete approved educational program**

A4094, which is sponsored by Assemblymen Herb Conaway, M.D. and Troy Singleton, was introduced to the assembly floor on January 13, 2015 and was referred to the Assembly Health and Senior Services Committee.

DAG Rodriguez explained to the Committee that by their statute, they cannot perform injectable. How this effects the athletic training profession, if it were to be enacted, would depend on how the Department of Health interpreted and enforce the law.

THE COMMITTEE ACCEPTED THIS AS INFORMATIONAL.

**B. P.L. 2015, Chap 13, Requires schools to maintain supply of epinephrine and permit administration of epinephrine to any student having anaphylactic reaction.**

After unanimous approval from both houses of the New Jersey legislature on February 5, 2015, and the governor's signature, the attached legislation is being presented to the committee for their review.

DAG Rodriguez explained to the Committee that the Athletic Trainers Practice Act does not permit injectables. Pursuant to the proposed statute the athletic trainer could obtain training from the Board of Education but the athletic trainer would not be providing the epinephrine under the A.T. scope of practice.
