On January 23, 2007, the Initial Decision of Administrative Law Judge Jesse H. Strauss in the matter of Dr. Priscilla Ilem was received by the Board. Written exceptions to the decision were received first by The Attorney General dated February 9, 2007 and by the respondent on February 13, 2007. The parties are scheduled to appear for oral argument. By way of background, The Attorney General initiated administrative proceedings against Dr. Ilem contending that Dr. Ilem prescribed Controlled Dangerous Substances during a period (on or about Feb. 7, 2001 until July 21, 2005) when she did not hold a valid registration with the DEA and further contends that Dr. Ilem falsified medical records which were submitted to the Board during the course of the investigation.

SISTER STATE MATTERS

1. Schwartz, George R.

By Provisional Order of Discipline issued on October 19, 2006 the Attorney General sought to suspend Dr. Schwartz's license until such time as his New Mexico and California licenses to practice medicine are fully reinstated without restriction. It is recommended that as indicated in the POD , the matter is subject to finalization thirty (30) days after issuance. Accordingly, the Attorney General seeks the entry of a Final Order of Discipline without modification. By way of background, Dr. Schwartz's medical license was revoked by the New Mexico Medical Board on March 31, 2006 for gross negligence and failure to maintain timely, accurate and complete medical records.

2. Meisher, Vlad A.

By Provisional Order of Discipline entered on November 15, 2006, The Attorney General seeks the suspension of Dr. Meisher's New Jersey license to practice medicine and surgery for a term of five (5) years and until such time as Dr. Meisher's license to practice medicine in the State of New York is fully reinstated without any restrictions. By way of history, on or about April 18, 2006, Dr. Meisher was found guilty of insurance fraud by the Supreme Court of the State of New York, Westchester County. This is a violation of New York Penal Law, 176.25, a class C felony.
