On June 27, 2002 an Administrative Action Complaint was filed by the Attorney General seeking the suspension or revocation of the license of the above captioned chiropractor. On August 12, 2002 an Answer was filed by Glen L. Schemanski, Esq. on behalf of Respondent. The matter was transferred to the Office of Administrative Law for a plenary hearing.

On July 13, 2004 an Initial Decision issued by Soloman A. Metzger, ALJ, was filed with the Board of Chiropractic Examiners. On July 15, 2004 a letter was received by Joan D. Gelber, DAG seeking to amplify some of the underlying evidence that may be helpful to the Board in evaluating the matter at its final hearing. On July 21, 2004 a letter was submitted by Glen L. Schemanski, Esq. taken exception to the findings and decision of Judge Metzger . This matter is now set down for a Final Hearing.
