PUBLIC SESSION MINUTES
THURSDAY, APRIL 28 , 2016**

A meeting of the New Jersey Board of Chiropractic Examiners was held on April 28, 2016 at the State Office Building, 124 Halsey Street, 6th floor, Newark, New Jersey in Sussex Conference Room on the 6th floor. The meeting was convened in accordance with the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act with previous notification having been sent to the Secretary of State and the following publications: The Record, Newark Star Ledger, Camden Courier Post, Trenton Times and Asbury Park Press to advise of the scheduling of this meeting. The meeting was called to order by David Allen, D.C., President of the Board, at 9:59 A.M. A roll call was taken and the following attendance was recorded and a quorum was present:

I. APPROVAL OF THE PUBLIC SESSION MINUTES OF MARCH 24, 2016

A motion was made by Dr. Senatore, which was seconded by Dr. Winters, to approve the public session minutes from the March 24, 2016 Board meeting as amended. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members voting in favor.

II. CONTINUING EDUCATION COMMITTEE

The continuing education committee reviewed 42 courses submitted by continuing education sponsors. The committee recommended that 39 courses be approved based on the information submitted for these courses. The committee identified 3 courses where references will be requested. A motion was made by Dr. Calio and seconded by Dr. Wartenberg, to approve the 39 courses. A vote was taken and motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

- A. Life University
RE: Course
- Success for the Chiropractic Lifestyle

Upon motion by Dr. Calio, which was seconded by Dr. Wartenberg, the Board voted to approve this course for 11 credits instead of twelve because the 3:30 p.m. time slot “nutrition” course appears to be a duplicate of the course offered at 11:30 a.m. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members voting in favor.

- B. Sherman College of Chiropractic
RE: Course
- Garden State Chiropractic Society Convention 2016

Upon motion by Dr. Calio, which was seconded by Dr. Wartenberg, the Board voted to approve the course, “Garden State Chiropractic Society Convention 2016” for 15 credits based on the additional information provided by Sherman College of Chiropractic. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members voting in favor.

IV. NEW BUSINESS

- A. Board discussion with Liza Ackerman, Regulatory Analyst
RE: Licensure of Chiropractic Assistants

On January 19, 2016, Governor Christie signed P.L.2015, c.283 which provides licensure for chiropractic assistants.

The Board formed a committee consisting of Dr. Allen, Dr. Calio, Dr. Senatore, and Dr. Wartenberg to begin the process of drafting regulations.

- B. Inquiry from Michael Chillemi, DC
RE: Scope of Practice

Dr. Chillemi inquired whether he may have a Mild(4psi) hyperbaric chamber in his office.

A motion was made by Dr. Calio, seconded by Dr. Senatore, to request that Dr. Chillemi describe what specifically he plans to use the hyperbaric chamber for in his office. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

Upon a motion made by Dr. Senatore, which was seconded by Dr. Winters, the Board voted to go into Executive Session to review and discuss applications for licensure and reinstatement. The motion carried by a unanimous vote. The Board returned to public session to continue the meeting and vote on the applications for licensure and reinstatement.

C. Application for Chiropractic Licensure and Reinstatement

1. Reza Pour Alizadeh, D.C. (Endorsement)

A motion was made by Dr. Lyons, which was seconded by Dr. Calio to approve Dr. Alizadeh's application for licensure. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

2. Kyle Scott Bilquist, D.C.

A motion was made by Dr. Wartenberg, which was seconded by Dr. Winter's, to approve Dr. Bilquist's application for licensure. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

3. Bial Hussain Shah, D.C.

A motion was made by Dr. Wartenberg, which was seconded by Dr. Calio, to approve Dr. Shah's application for licensure. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

4. David Luke Dijkstra, D.C.

A motion was made by Dr. Calio, which was seconded by Dr. Winters, to approve Dr. Dijkstra's application for licensure. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

5. Sukhjit Hatthi-Sangha, D.C.

A motion was made by Dr. Winters, which was seconded by Dr. Lyons, to approve Dr. Hothi-Sangha's application for reinstatement. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

6. Scott Louis Cavgnuolo, D.C.

A motion was made by Dr. Senatore, which was seconded by Dr. Lyons, to request that Dr. Cavgnuolo provide the Board with documentation of outcome of the malpractice suit that is currently pending against him. The Board will review Dr. Cavgnuolo's application once it receives the requested information.

A vote was taken and Dr. Wartenberg abstained with all other members present voted in favor. The motion passed.

7. John R. Law, D.C.

A motion was made by Dr. Lyons, seconded by Dr. Senatore, to request that Dr. Law provide the Board with contract and lease agreement(s) for his office space rentals. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

8. Fernando Barrese, D.C.

A motion was made by Dr. Wartenberge, seconded by Dr. Calio to schedule Dr. Barrese for an appearance before the Board. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

V. BOARD ELECTIONS

Dr. Allen was nominated for President of the Board at the Board's March 24, 2016 meeting. Ms. Tadeo called for further nominations for President of the Board and there were none. Dr. Calio then made a motion, seconded by Dr. Wartenberg to close the nominations and elect Dr. Allen for President of the Board by acclamation. The vote of the Board was unanimous.

Dr. Stabile and Dr. Wartenberg were nominated for Vice President of the Board at the Board's March 24, 2016 meeting. Ms. Tadeo called for further nominations and there were none. Dr. Senatore then made a motion, seconded by Dr. Allen to close the nominations. A vote was taken to elect Dr. Stabile for Vice President. Dr. Allen, Dr. Senatore, Dr. Lyons, and Dr. Winters voted in favor while all others voted in opposition. The vote passed. A vote was taken to elect Dr. Wartenberg for Vice President. Dr. Calio and Dr. Wartenberg voted in favor while all others voted in opposition. The vote did not pass. Dr. Stabile was elected Vice President.

Dr. Calio was nominated for Secretary of the Board at the Board's March 24, 2016 meeting. Ms. Tadeo called for further nominations for Secretary of the Board and there were none. Dr. Senatore then made a motion, seconded by Dr. Winters to close the nominations and elect Dr. Calio Secretary of the Board by acclamation. The vote of the Board was unanimous.

Dr. Winters was nominated for Treasurer of the Board at the Board's March 24, 2016 meeting. Ms. Tadeo called for further nominations for Treasurer of the Board and there were none. Dr. Senatore then made a motion, seconded by Dr. Lyons to close the nominations and elect Dr. Winters Treasurer of the Board by acclamation. The vote of the Board was unanimous.

The Federation of Chiropractic Licensing Boards held their 90th annual meeting in Pheonix Arizona on April 27th through May 1, 2016.
