PUBLIC SESSION MINUTES

THURSDAY, JULY 28, 2011

A meeting of the New Jersey Board of Chiropractic Examiners was held July 28, 2011 at the State Office Building, 124 Halsey Street, 6th floor, Newark New Jersey. The meeting was convened in accordance with the provision of the Open Public Meetings Act with previous notification having been sent to the Secretary of State and the following publications: The Record, Newark Star Ledger, Camden Courier Post, Trenton Times and Asbury Park Press to advise of the scheduling of this meeting. The meeting was called to order by Albert Stabile Jr., D.C., President of the Board, at 9:45 A.M..

I. APPROVAL OF THE PUBLIC SESSION MINUTES OF JUNE 23, 2011

A motion was made by Dr. Allen, which was seconded by Dr. Krouse, to approve the public session minutes of the May 26, 2011 meeting as amended. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

The Board discussed the statement and motion in the June minutes concerning the CE course from Sherman about Network Spinal Analysis.

A motion was made by Dr. Calio, which was seconded by Dr. O'Connor, to approve the courses that were recommended for approval by continuing education committee. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

A motion was made by Dr. Calio, which was seconded by Dr. O'Connor, to approve the recommendations of the committee to amend the course hour request from Texas Chiropractic College for "nutrition response testing" from 13 hours to 12 hours. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

A motion was made by Dr. Calio, which was seconded by Dr. O'Connor, to approve the recommendation to not approve the following courses for CE credit.. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

A motion was made by Dr. Calio, which was seconded by Dr. Spadafino, to approve the recommendation of the committee to discuss the following courses at the September meeting. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

IV. OPEN DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

A. STEVEN WADE MARK, D.C.

The Board reviewed a Consent Order filed by the Board on July 6, 2011.

This was received as informational.

V. APPLICATIONS FOR LICENSURE

A. CHARLES NISIVOCIA, D.C. (REINSTATEMENT)

A motion was made by Dr. O'Connor, which was seconded by Dr. Allen, to have Dr. Nisivoccia take the SPEC, JP Exam and schedule for a full Board appearance. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

B. ANTHONY J. VICHETO, D.C. (ENDORSEMENT)

A motion was made by Dr. Krouse, which was seconded by Dr. Calio, to request an explanation about the incident(s) in Mississippi, and schedule him for a full Board appearance. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

C. IVAN MEZEL, D.C. (ENDORSEMENT)

A motion was made by Dr. Calio, which was seconded by Dr. Senatore, to deny the application... Although CMCC has been approved by the Board for chiropractic education, Dr. Mezel does not have the required undergraduate education, and his experience does not qualify him either. Additionally, the exam he passed in Canada in 1975 consisted of 10 essay questions over 7 days, which is not substantively equivalent to the exam required in New Jersey. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

D. JOSEPH T. CANOVA, D.C. (ELECTRO-DIAGNOSTIC PERMIT)

A motion was made by Dr. Calio, which was seconded by Dr. Spadafino, to deny the application. The certificate issued in 1998 granted him 60 credits. He may apply these credits toward the current requirement of 120 credits. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

E. ERIC GLICKMAN, D.C. - (REINSTATEMENT)

Dr. Glickman appeared with counsel, Jeffrey Randolph, Esq.

* At the conclusion of his testimony, the Board moved to Executive Session for discussion.

A motion was made by Dr. O'Connor, which was seconded by Dr. Allen, to approve Dr. Glickman's application for reinstatement. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

VI. INQUIRIES

A. MS. PAM EVERETT

Submitted a copy of an advertisement for a lecture by a chiropractor "unresolved thyroid"

(Dr. Krouse was recused)

Table and request that Ms. Everett submit additional information about the advertisement and the lecture.

B. ANONYMOUS I/M/O OAKLAND SPINE & REHABILITATION CENTER

The inquiry was in regards to, whether a chiropractor may offer patients an entry into a raffle for a flat screen TV for referring patients to his office.

A motion was made by Dr. O'Connor, which was seconded by Dr. Calio, to find insufficient information to pursue this matter further. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

C. ROBERT E. LEE, D.C.

Inquiring as to whether a chiropractic assistant may provide cold laser therapy treatments.

A motion was made by Dr. O'Connor, which was seconded by Dr. Krouse, that the Board discussed the provisions listed in N.J.A.C. 13:44E-2.7(c) and determined that this treatment should be included as an attended modality, and this matter should be referred to the rules and regs. committee to discuss adding it to the regulations. A vote was taken and the motion did not pass. The vote was 5-2 (Spadafino and Calio opposed).

A motion was made by Dr. Senatore, which was seconded by Dr. Krouse, to refer this matter to the Rules & Regs. Committee. A vote was taken and the motion passed with all members present voting in favor.

VII. MISCELLANEOUS

A. TEXAS BOARD OF CHIROPRACTIC EXAMINERS

Received as informational.

ADJOURNMENT

A MOTION WAS MADE BY DR. CALIO, WHICH WAS SECONDED BY DR. SENATORE, TO GO INTO EXECUTIVE SESSION AT 11:00 A.M., TO CONSIDER THREE PIC SUMMARIES, THREE REFERRALS FROM OTHER STATE AGENCIES, ONE CONSUMER COMPLAINT AND TWO OPEN COMPLAINTS.
