7. Letter dated March 15, 2014, received from Donald A. Clare, t/a New Jersey Education and Seminars, LLC, requesting that the Board reconsider approving the course entitled "Electrical Plan Review and Inspection of Residential and Multi-Family Structures in the SFHA". Mr. Clare states that the course takes the student through the entire process of identifying a SFHA, locating the flood prevention ordinance in the community, and locating the structure to identify the BFE and Flood Zone.

Mr. Clare states that the course also teaches the contractor what regulations apply while the contractor is designing the project, proposing his plan to the client, and implementing his plan with full anticipation of approval by the electrical inspector during the regulatory process and inspection.

The Board voted to disapprove this course as it did not appear to be specific to electrical contractors.

SIX-MONTH EXTENSION

MALIK HAMID, LICENSE #13005

8. Letter dated April 16, 2014, received from Abdul Malik I. Hamid requesting a six-month continuance of business under Permit #13005 according to N.J.S.A. 45:5A-14. The licensee, Malik Hamid, died on March 13, 2014.

Mr. Hamid states he has been with his father's company for more than ten years and would like to complete the projects he and his father started.

CAPE MAY COUNTY MUNICIPAL UTILITIES AUTHORITY

10. Letter dated February 4, 2014, received from Thomas J. LaRocco, P.E., Chief Engineer, stating the continuing education requirement appears to conflict with the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs.

Mr. LaRocco states he has been advised that even though IBC-NJ 2012 was published approximately two years ago, the NJDCA has no plans to adopt it. Rather, the NJDCA will wait until the IBC-NJ 2015 comes out and will start the review process at that time. It appears even though a new code of discipline is published, it is by no means immediately adopted as published.

Mr. LaRocco further states electrical contractors are required to complete a ten hour course of study relating to the most recent edition of the National Electrical Code. Considering the most recent edition of the National Electrical Code, NEC 2014, is not currently adopted for use in New Jersey, why is the Board requiring electrical contractors study NEC 2014 to receive a license?

Mr. LaRocco states the phrase in the Board's statutes should read "the currently adopted electrical code in the State of New Jersey".
