4. Copy of a letter addressed to The Honorable Richard Constable, Commissioner, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs and Steve C. Lee, Acting Director, New Jersey Division of Consumer Affairs, received on May 22, 2014, signed by Eric DeGesero, Executive Director, New Jersey Independent Electrical Contractors, stating it has come to the attention of the NJ-IEC when an individual or company purchases a home with the intent of selling it in short order "flipping" they are being permitted to perform the electrical work themselves without a licensed electrician with a valid business permit. Mr. DeGesero also states this is in clear contravention of the law as the purchaser does not solely occupy the residence which is in violation of N.J.S.A. 45:5A-18(n).
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
