

LEGALIZED GAMES OF CHANCE CONTROL COMMISSION
PUBLIC SESSION MINUTES
March 16, 2005

A meeting of the Legalized Games of Chance Control Commission was held on March 16, 2005 at the Trump Marina Hotel and Casino in Atlantic City, New Jersey, Biscayne Room A. Present for the meeting were Chairperson Marilou C. Halvorsen, Commissioners Christine Vanek, Esq., Edward F. Barrett, (Timothy E. Ryan on conference call) and Frank Ragazzo who arrived at the meeting at 12:30, Executive Officer William J. Yorke (EO), Deputy Attorney General (DAG) Jodi Krugman, Assistant Director of the Regulated Business section of OCP Veronica Hursthouse, Acting Division Director Jeffrey Burstein, Assistant Director of Investigations, OCP, James Carter, arrived at the meeting 12:50 p.m., Investigators Annette Misukonis, Martin Silva and Joseph Cheesare, support staff Michelle Rouette, Farah Rodriguez, and Danyelle Williamson.

The meeting was opened at 12:07 p.m. by Chairperson Marilou Halvorsen pursuant to provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act, N.J.S.A. 10:4-1 et seq.

GENERAL DISCUSSION

1. Acting Director of the Division of Consumer Affairs Jeffrey Burstein (Advise the Commission of its reassignment to the Office of Consumer Protection) Director Burstein addressed the Commission regarding the reorganization of the Office of Consumer Protection. The Legalized Games of Chance Control Commission and its staff will be placed under the administration of the Office of Consumer Protection. The Commission's statutory authority will be unaffected. The main purpose of this change is the investigative functions of the Commission. The Attorney General's Office wants to place extra emphasis on the training and improving the quality of investigations throughout OCP and DCA as a whole. James Carter is Assistant Director of Investigations in OCP. He will be responsible for investigator training and investigative procedures. Acting Director Burstein assures the Commission that his role in problem solving for Legalized Games will be totally pro-active. Chairperson Halvorsen thanked Director Burstein for his involvement with the Commission. Chairperson Halvorsen states that the Commission fully respects the authority of the Office of the Attorney General but feels that the Commission's concerns are not being given proper consideration. Currently, she asserted that there are no less than twenty proposed regulations approved for publication by the Commission in the past four years still pending approval by the Division of Consumer Affairs and the Attorney General's Office.

Also, Chairperson Halvorsen states that the decision to implement this reorganization structure between Legalized Games of Chance and the Office of Consumer Protection was made without the input or approval of the Commission thus taking it by complete surprise. Commissioner Ryan expressed his concerns to Director Burstein about the history of the Commission working within the Office of Consumer Protection. Commissioner Ryan states that in the past when LGCCC was assigned to OCP the outcome was negative and not beneficial to either party. Director Burstein in response to these concerns assured the Commission that the negative situations from the past will not reoccur as the structure and manner in which the system is run will be more efficient and beneficial to everyone. Director Burstein promised a fresh start for everyone as he will be pro-active in any problems which may arise between the Commission and OCP. Chairperson Halvorsen then stated that she is pleased with how far the Commission has come. LGCCC has a full Commission, a pro-active counsel, a hardworking Executive Officer, and direct involvement from the Investigative Supervisor, Martin Silva. She is concerned that all of this progress could be affected by the reorganization of LGCCC. Commissioner Barrett expressed his concerns regarding LGCCC's status as far as utilization of personnel. Commissioner Barrett is concerned if there will be enough investigators on the NJ Boardwalk this summer to properly protect the public. He also expressed concern regarding the priority of work assigned to the investigators on the Commission's payroll, and whether they will be used for investigations other than Legalized Games? Director Burstein states the resources may be pooled with the Division's Charities Registration and Investigation Unit, but the investigators' primary work will remain the same. Commissioner Barrett is also concerned about whether OCP or the Commission will determine the

Commission's investigative priorities. Director Burstein in response states that OCP is open to the Commission's input on all issues. The Commission's input will be considered in all decisions concerning investigative resources.

2. Minutes of the Public Session meeting of January 12, 2005 - The Commission approved the Public Session minutes of the January 12, 2005 meeting.

3. Public Comment - Edward R. McGlynn, Esq., lobbyist for the New Jersey Amusement Association, informed the Commission that Dr. Harold Nolan, Monmouth College Professor, had been retained by the Association to study and compile a report regarding the current price to play amusement games and the value of prizes awarded. Dr. Nolan's report has been presented to the Commission. It indicates that increasing the charge to play to \$10.00 and the value of prizes awarded to \$10,000.00, is justified. The Association requests that the Commission hold a public hearing, as required by law to receive comment in this regard. Mr. McGlynn asked that the hearing be expedited as the amusement season is beginning in May. The Commission moved to hold a public hearing as requested by the Association. The transcript of the hearing and the report submitted by the Association will be reviewed by the Commission's Regulations Committee who will make a recommendation to the Commission.

Mr. McGlynn, also thanked Acting Director Jeffrey Burstein for meeting with him to discuss the Amusement Association's issues. The Amusement Association has previously worked with the Division of Consumer Affairs and found Assistant Director of Regulated Business for OCP, Roni Hursthouse to be very instrumental in the completion of 180 certifications. The Amusement Association extends an offer of full cooperation with the Division of Consumer Affairs. Mr. McGlynn who also represents the New Jersey Casino Theme Party Planners Association stated also in attendance for public comment was Ms. Lisa Graham, President of Tumbling Dice, a casino night equipment provider. She was in attendance to discuss regulations governing Casino Night Workers. Chairperson Halvorsen advised Ms. Graham that the Regulatory Committee would be the appropriate body with which to discuss regulations. Lou Kammerman from Game Tab also attended for public comment. He is seeking a list of organizations conducting instant raffles from LGCCC that would inform him as to who is approved so that he would know what customers to pursue. Executive Officer, William J. Yorke, stated that if given time, he would gladly provide Game Tab with the list.

4. Statistics report and comparison figures from LGCCC to DCA for the months of December 2004, & January, 2005 - The Commission reviewed and accepted the statistics report and comparison figures as presented. The report is attached to and made part of these minutes on file.

Commissioner Ryan has requested a copy of the report submitted to the Commission.(NOTE: This was already done, prior to the meeting) A motion was made to authorize the required a public hearing.
