DIVISION OF CONSUMER AFFAIRS OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY ADVISORY COUNCIL PUBLIC SESSION MINUTES

September 16, 2010

The New Jersey State Occupational Therapy Advisory Council held its meeting on September 16, 2010, at the State Office Building at 124 Halsey Street, 6th Floor, Newark, N.J. The meeting was convened in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act with previous notification having been sent to the Secretary of State and the following publications: The Record in Bergen County, The Star Ledger, Camden Courier Post, Trenton Times, Aisling Swift Press of Atlantic City and Asbury Park Press, to advise of the scheduling of this meeting. The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Betty Thomas at 9:15 a.m.

Opening Statement - Regarding compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act

I. MINUTES

The Council, upon motion made by Mariann E. Moran seconded by Tiffany Charles, voted to approve the May 13, 2010 Public Session Minutes as amended.

II. LEGISLATION

A. Assembly Bills

A-3107

This bill introduced on July 1, 2010, limits rescheduling, cancelation, and no-show fees providers of health care services may charge in certain instances.

The Council agrees that providers should be clear with patients/clients regarding fees charged, particularly fees for unused or canceled appointments. The Council believes however, the bill seek to impose rigid rules for such events and that these matters are better handled between the professionl and the patient/client.

A-2548

This bill requires health insurers, SHBP and SEHBP to provide coverage for vision rehabilitation services to covered person experiencing sudden onset of blindness.

The Council support this bill and also request that the occupational therapists should be included.

B. Senate Bills

S-1890

This bill introduced on May 13, 2010, requires that all public bodies covered by the provision of the Open Public Meetings Act have a United States flag displayed in the meeting room and that the person presiding lead those present in a recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance.

The Council was neutral regarding this bill. The Council will defer to the Director.

III. RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Use of physical agent modalities by occupational therapy assistants

Regulatory Analyst, Maryan Sheehan, provided a copy of the ACOTE Accreditation Standards for OTA programs in order to continue discussion regarding an amendment to the rule to include the utilization of advanced physical agent modalities by an occupational therapy assistant. The Council discussed educational programs and/or available training dedicated to assistants.

The Council offered the floor to the individuals present at the meeting and heard their opinions regarding this issue. It was concluded that education, appropriate supervision, and training were essential in consideration of an amendment to the rule.

Based on the discussion, advice and comments, Regulatory Analyst Maryann Sheehan will prepare a draft to be presented at the next meeting.

IV. MODALITIES COURSES APPROVAL

A. Request for approval of modalities courses by providers.

Pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:44K-5.4 Use of physical agent modalities.

The Council, upon motion made by Maryann Moran and seconded by Tiffany Charles, accepted the Committee recommendations to approve the following providers of modalities courses.

- 1. DUNAMIS Training LLC
- 2. Universal Institute Inc.
- 3. JDT Medical Rehab Center/Lincoln Park

V. "60 days Provision"

The Council reviewed procedures with regard to the guidelines for the acceptance of applicants to practice under the 60 days provision. The Council agreed that three (3) most important aspects to consider are equivalency for licensure from the other State, the applicant's education, and complete results of a Criminal History Background Check, before the individual may be accepted and/or authorized to practice in New Jersey for 60 days.

The Council approved the request from Carole Swartz, OT to be permitted to work under the 60 days rule.
