III. NEW BUSINESS

- a. A fax from from **Kailash Chand**, inquiring as to whether physician assistants can operate a YAG laser for permanent hair reduction, a fraction laser for skin resurfacing (for acne scar and uneven skin and wrinkles) and Genesis for skin rejuvenation — all without the supervision of a physician.
- b. A fax from **David Smith, MHA, President, Medical Investigation Group, Inc.**, inquiring as to whether physician assistants in the State of New Jersey can perform osteopathic manipulation when the supervising physician is an osteopath.
- c. A fax from **Michael Rofsky, regional Pharmacy Supervisor, Costco Wholesale**, inquiring as to whether a prescription written for CDS medication on a Jersey City Medical Center prescription blank by a physician assistant with no collaborative physicians name on the prescription blank, is valid.
- d. A fax from **Timothy S. Lopresti, physician assistant**, requesting a list of surgical privileges given to physician assistants.
- e. A fax from **Darcy L. Malin, Advanced Orthopaedic**, inquiring as to whether a

physician whose name does not appear on the physician assistant prescription blank can supervise that physician assistant.

- f. An e-mail from **Robert Alderman, physician assistant**, advising that he plans to work as a subcontractor for the Federal government in New Jersey and inquiring as to whether he must obtain a New Jersey license and have a supervising physician who has a New Jersey medical license.
- g. **Physician Assistants Rule Review - Executive Order #2**, requires that all Board rules be reviewed to ensure that they comply with the “Common Sense Principles” established in the EO, the most important of which is that rules should be drafted so as to impose the least burden and costs to businesses.

A review conducted by DAG Levine, Regulatory Analyst, Maryann Sheehan and Kathleen Griffith found that no rules needed to be amended or repealed.
