## Anthony Comerford, Ph.D., TP #063-677

Dr. Comerford wrote requesting an extension of his three-year supervised temporary permit beyond its expiration of April 4, 2009. Dr. Comerford stated that he was just informed that he is eligible to take the E.P.P.P. written examination and is currently waiting to receive the material from the Professional Examination (PES). Dr. Comerford further stated that the permit extension would allow him to complete the licensure process. Upon motion made by Dr. Roy and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board voted to extend Dr. Comerford's temporary permit for an additional year contingent upon him taking the E.P.P.P. written examination on or before October 31, 2009. Dr. Comerford was informed that his temporary permit will now expire on April 4, 2010. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

## Thomas Grace, Psy.D., TP #063-666

Dr. Grace wrote requesting an extension of his three-year supervised temporary permit beyond its expiration date of March 7, 2009. Dr. Grace stated that he is currently in the process of studying for the E.P.P.P. written examination and intends on taking it by August 2009. Upon motion made by Dr. Roy and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board voted to extend Dr. Grace's temporary permit for an additional year contingent upon taking the E.P.P.P. written examination on or before August 31, 2009. Dr. Grace was informed that his temporary permit will now expire on March 7, 2010. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

## Marcie Handler, Ph.D., TP #063-727

Dr. Handler wrote requesting an extension of the 90-day limit to submit her work sample for the oral examination beyond her March 26, 2009 submission date. Dr. Handler stated that she recently gave birth to her second child in February 2009 and is unable to complete the work sample for submission. Upon motion made by Dr. Brickfield and seconded by Dr. Roy, the Board voted to grant Dr. Handler an additional six months to submit her work sample for the oral examination. Dr. Handler was informed that her work sample is now due on or before September 30, 2009. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

Dr. Kinderlehrer wrote requesting an extension of her three-year supervised temporary permit beyond its expiration date of April 28, 2009. Dr. Kinderlehrer stated that she has almost completed her supervised hours and needs to take the written and oral examinations. Upon motion made by Dr. Brickfield and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board voted to extend Dr. Kinderlehrer's temporary permit for an additional year. Dr. Kinderlehrer was informed that her temporary permit will now expire on April 28, 2010. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

Janet N. Sotomayor, Ph.D.

Dr. Sotomayor wrote requesting an extension of the 90-day limit to submit her work sample for the oral examination beyond her April 2, 2009 submission date. Dr. Sotomayor stated that her father passed away on January 19, 2009 and since that time, she has not been able to complete her work sample for submission. Upon motion made by Dr. Roy and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board voted to grant Dr. Sotomayor an additional 90 days to submit her work sample for the oral examination. Dr. Sotomayor was informed that her work sample is now due in the Board office on or before July 3, 2009. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

Christine Ferri, Ph.D., TP #043-524

Dr. Ferri wrote requesting an extension of the 90-day limit to submit her work sample for the oral examination beyond her February 21, 2009 submission date. Dr. Ferri listed reasons that she experienced difficulties in obtaining an appropriate case for the basis of her work sample. Upon motion made by Dr. Roy and seconded by Dr. Brickfield, the Board voted to grant Dr. Ferri an additional year to submit her work sample for the oral examination. Dr. Ferri was informed that her work sample is now due in the Board office on or before February 21, 2010. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

Cloey Talotta, Psy.D., #4577

Dr. Talotta wrote to inform the Board that she received a letter from Magellan stating that she is ineligible to be credentialed due to her internship in school psychology. This is despite being licensed as a psychologist in the State of New Jersey and having completed an APA approved program at Rutgers University. Dr. Talotta further stated that she noticed in the Board's May 2008 minutes that Barry Helfmann, Psy.D. brought this issue to the Board's attention. The Board accepted the letter as informational as the Board has no jurisdiction over whom an insurance company accepts..

Jill Harris, Ph.D., #1977

Dr. Harris wrote to inquire, when working with clients between the ages of 14-18 with significant cognitive impairments how to handle a request for release of mental health records. Is the parent's written consent sufficient as the client may not be capable of giving informed consent? If so, how should it be documented? Dr. Harris further inquired as to whether a mental health clinician in an exempt setting who is in the process of applying for licensure needs to have notes co-signed by a licensed psychologist or supervisor. Upon motion made by Dr. Groveman and seconded by Dr. Roy, the Board voted to inform Dr. Harris that when making an exception to the Board's regulations, the Board advises that one be guided by their own legal counsel as to what documentation for the exception would be necessary. With regard to having client records co-signed, Dr. Harris was informed that there is no current Board regulation, but may be a requirement of some insurance companies. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

Ronald Canella, Ed.D., #1198

Dr. Canella wrote to inform the Board that he has been denied employment as a staff member by a local private hospital because their policy dictates that only psychologists with the Ph.D. degree can be hired. Upon motion made by Dr. Roy and seconded by Dr. Brickfield, the Board voted to inform the hospital

(copied to Dr. Canella) that the Board issues licenses based on course work requirements for a doctoral degree not on a specific degree, although the Board has no jurisdiction over hiring standards that the hospital establishes for itself. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

Burt Liebman, Division of Consumer Affairs

Mr. Liebman submitted for the Board's review a sentence from the Cullen Law in which the term "emotional harm" is being used and request that the Board define "emotional harm." Upon motion made by Dr. Roy and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board voted to inform Mr. Liebman that the sentence in which "emotional harm" is being used seems reasonable. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

Jami F. Young, Ph.D.

Dr. Young's file was brought before the Board because she submitted her work sample for the oral examination and the Oral Examination Work Sample Cover Sheet indicated that the last date of psychological services was May 19, 2005. Dr. Young had previously submitted a letter in May 2008 requesting clarification as to whether she can submit a therapy case or program development case for her oral examination. Dr. Young was informed by letter that she could submit either a therapy case or program development. However, Dr. Young was not informed that the case must be a "current" one either in progress or for which the treatment services were terminated within one year before the submission of the work sample. Upon motion made by Dr. Brickfield and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board voted to accept the work sample submitted by Dr. Young. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

Eugene Gadson, M.A., #731

The Board reviewed the Rutgers University transcript submitted by Dr. Gadson in an effort to determine if the Psy.D. he has obtained would meet the Board's educational criteria to update his licensing record to reflect the highest degree earned. Upon motion made by Dr. Roy and seconded by Dr. Brickfield, the Board voted to inform Senator Shirley K. Turner that pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:42-2.1 (d) "no more than 1/3 of the doctoral credits shall have been transferred from other regionally/nationally accredited graduate schools." Dr. Gadson's transcript from Rutgers University reveals that fifty percent of the credits for the degree were transferred from another university. The Board regrets that the request can not be honored because the degree does not meet the requirements established by regulation. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

Board of Social Work Examiners

Executive Director Kay McCormack has indicated that the Board of Social Work Examiners has reviewed the Board's Proposed Readoption w/Amendments: N.J.A.C. 13:42; and Proposed Repeal: N.J.A.C. 13:42-10.15. Consequently, the Board of Social Work Examiners accepted the notice as informational and offered no comment. The Board accepted the notice as informational.

Francis McGovern, Ph.D., #2523

Dr. McGovern wrote requesting a waiver of N.J.A.C. 13:42-4.4 to supervise a fourth permit holder. Dr. McGovern was previously granted permission to take on a fourth permit holder for supervision, however, since that approval his situation at work has changed and the supervision never took place. Dr. McGovern is now requesting that the Board approve a different permit holder than the one listed in his previous request. Dr. McGovern has further stated that he is currently the only licensed psychologist at Greystone Park Psychiatric Hospital who can provide supervision to the unlicensed psychologist employed there. Upon motion made by Dr. Groveman and seconded by Dr. Roy, the Board voted to inform Dr. McGovern that under the current circumstances, he is permitted to supervise a fourth permit holder. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

Lorryn Wahler, New Jersey Psychological Association (NJPA)

Ms. Wahler has stated that many of their members were inquiring about the arrangement between supervisors and permit holders; specifically, that permit holders can no longer be designated as "independent contractors" working under the supervision of a licensed psychologist. Ms. Wahler has specific questions regarding the financial and business arrangements as set forth in N.J.A.C. 13:42-4.6. Upon motion made by Dr. Roy and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board advised that permit holders must be an employee, full or part-time and only permitted to work no more than 20 client contact hours per week. The board will ask its regulations committee to research possible future options concerning this regulation. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

#### REPORT ON TEMPORARY PERMIT CONFERENCE HELD ON 4/6/09–ROY/GROVEMAN

Maria Kirchner, Ph.D./Joseph Fischer, Psy.D., supervisor (Present)

Dr. Kirchner took and failed the E.P.P.P. written examination taken on February 17, 2009 and is currently working under a three-year supervised temporary permit. Upon motion made by Dr. Roy and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board voted to continue Dr. Kirchner's temporary permit limiting her to two (2) client hours. Additionally, the Board suggested that Dr. Kirchner may want to put her permit on "inactive" status since she is not currently seeing patients. Dr. Kirchner was reminded that her temporary permit expires on October 22, 2010. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

Marcel Tabone, Psy.D./Mariann Pokalo, Ph.D., supervisor (Present)

Dr. Tabone took and failed the written examination taken on February 27, 2009 and is currently working under a three-year supervised temporary permit. Upon motion made by Dr. Roy and seconded by Dr. Brickfield, the Board voted to continue Dr. Tabone's temporary permit with no changes. Additionally, the Board suggested that Dr. Tabone put his temporary permit in "inactive" status if he is not currently seeing patients. Dr. Tabone was reminded that his temporary permit expires on October 23, 2009. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

Michael Weissman, Psy.D./Linda Earley, Psy.D., supervisor (Present)

Dr. Weissman took and failed the E.P.P.P. written examination taken on February 28, 2009 and is currently working under a three-year supervised temporary permit. Upon motion made by Dr. Roy and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board voted not to extend Dr. Weissman's temporary permit because he is not currently working in a private setting in the State of New Jersey. However, the Board stated that, should his employment status change, Dr. Weissman would need to submit a letter to the Board office requesting an extension of his temporary permit. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

#### REGULATIONS N.J.A.C.13:42

The Board reviewed N.J.A.C. 13:42-3.6 and Subchapter 12; N.J.A.C. 13:42-12 and made minor changes. Upon motion made by Dr. Groveman and seconded by Dr. Brickfield, the Board voted to accept and approve the changes. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

#### REVIEW OF EXEMPTION NOTICE FORMS (RENEWALS)

JFK Medical Center/Johnson Rehabilitation Institute

The Board reviewed a continuation of exemption status request from Keith Cicerone, Ph.D. After review of the information provided in the continuation request, and upon motion made by Dr. Brickfield and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board determined that JFK Medical Center/Johnson Rehabilitation Institute continues to qualify as an exempt facility pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 45:14B-6 (a)3. Dr. Cicerone will be reminded that, in order to continue exempt status, the agency is required to confirm annually that it continues to meet the qualifications for exempt status. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

## Bancroft NeuroHealth

The Board reviewed a continuation of exemption status request from Jennifer DeLuca, Licensing Accrediting Specialist. After review of the information provided in the continuation request, and upon motion made by Dr. Brickfield and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board determined that Bancroft NeuroHealth continues to qualify as an exempt facility pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 45:14B-6 (a)3. Ms. DeLuca will be reminded that, in order to continue exempt status, the agency is required to confirm annually that it continues to meet the qualifications for exempt status. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

## West Bergen Mental HealthCare, Inc.

The Board reviewed a continuation of exemption status request from Michael J. Torroli, CEO.

After review of the information provided in the continuation request, and upon motion made by Dr. Brickfield and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board determined that West Bergen Mental HealthCare, Inc. continues to qualify as an exempt facility pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 45:14B-6 (a)3. Mr. Torroli will be reminded that, in order to continue exempt status, the agency is required to confirm annually that it continues to meet the qualifications for exempt status. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

## NewBridge Services, Inc.

The Board reviewed a continuation of exemption status request from Michelle Borden, LCSW, Associate Executive Director

After review of the information provided in the continuation request, and upon motion made by Dr. Brickfield and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board determined that NewBridge Services, Inc. continues to qualify as an exempt facility pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 45:14B-6 (a)3. Ms. Borden will be reminded that, in order to continue exempt status, the agency is required to confirm annually that it continues to meet the qualifications for exempt status. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

## Pascack Mental Health Center

The Board reviewed a continuation of exemption status request from Jorge Becerra, Executive Director.

After review of the information provided in the continuation request, and upon motion made by Dr. Brickfield and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board determined that Pascack Mental Health Center continues to qualify as an exempt facility pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 45:14B-6 (a)3. Mr. Becerra will be reminded that, in order to continue exempt status, the agency is required to confirm annually that it continues to meet the qualifications for exempt status. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

## Jersey City Medical Center

The Board reviewed a continuation of exemption status request from James A. Martin, Vice President, Behavioral Health.

After review of the information provided in the continuation request, and upon motion made by Dr. Brickfield and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board determined that Jersey City Medical Center continues to qualify as an exempt facility pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 45:14B-6 (a)3. Mr. Martin will be reminded that, in order to continue exempt status, the agency is required to confirm annually that it continues to meet the qualifications for exempt status. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

## Dorothy B. Hersh Regional Child Protection Center

The Board reviewed a continuation of exemption status request from Jamila Irons-Johnson, Psy.D.

After review of the information provided in the continuation request, and upon motion made by Dr. Brickfield and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board determined that Dorothy B. Hersh Regional Child Protection Center continues to qualify as an exempt facility pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 45:14B-6 (a)3. Dr. Irons-Johnson will be reminded that, in order to continue exempt status, the agency is required to confirm annually that it continues to meet the qualifications for exempt status. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

#### Trinitas Hospital

The Board reviewed a continuation of exemption status request from Rodger Goddard, Ph.D.

After review of the information provided in the continuation request, and upon motion made by Dr. Brickfield and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board determined that Trinitas Hospital continues to qualify as an exempt facility pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 45:14B-6 (a)3. Dr. Goddard will be reminded that, in order to continue exempt status, the agency is required to confirm annually that it continues to meet the qualifications for exempt status. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

#### Family & Children's Services

The Board reviewed a continuation of exemption status request from Maureen O'Leary.

After review of the information provided in the continuation request, and upon motion made by Dr. Brickfield and seconded by Dr. Groveman, the Board determined that Family & Children's Services continues to qualify as an exempt facility pursuant to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 45:14B-6 (a)3. Ms. O'Leary will be reminded that, in order to continue exempt status, the agency is required to confirm annually that it continues to meet the qualifications for exempt status. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

#### PUBLIC DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

I/M/O Jack Goralsky, Psy.D., #1285

The Board reviewed a letter submitted by Dr. Goralsky naming Mark H. Seglin, Ph.D. as a proposed supervisor for Board approval to satisfy the terms of his Consent Order. Upon motion made by Dr. Groveman and seconded by Dr. Brickfield, the Board noted that Dr. Goralsky submitted neither a resume nor a statement from Dr. Seglin indicating present or past relationships with Dr. Goralsky with his request. The Board directed Executive Director Walker to inform Dr. Goralsky that approval cannot be granted without the proper documentation. Voting in favor of the motion: all.

I/M/O Alvin Krass, Ph.D. # 275(revoked)

A Final Order Granting Summary Decision and Revoking the license of Dr. Krass to practice psychology was filed on March 6, 2009. The effective date of revocation was March 16, 2009.

I/M/O Alvin Krass, Ph.D. # 275(revoked)

I. Mark Cohen, Esquire filed a Motion on behalf of Dr. Krass to Modify the Oral Decision of the Board to extend the effective date of the surrender and revocation of the license from March 16, 2009 to May 16, 2009. This motion was to be determined on the papers by the Board at the March 2, 2009 meeting as the State informed the Board it was not taking a position in this matter. Due to inclement weather on March 2, 2009 the Board meeting was cancelled and rescheduled for April 6, 2009.

This matter was reviewed and considered by Nancy Friedman, Ph.D., chairperson of the Board. The chairperson's decision is subject to ratification by the Board at the April 6, 2009 meeting. Upon review of the submissions, Dr. Friedman determined that the request for extension be granted until Monday April 6, 2009. In support of the motion, the certification of Dr. Krass was submitted indicating that he was unable to

find alternative care givers for his existing clients. Of the 16 clients in his practice, he had referred 12 to other health care providers and had issues placing four other clients for whom he alleged he required two additional months to complete the termination of the therapeutic relationship. His certification did not provide any information that his clients were seriously impaired or may have serious psychological risk or any reason which might require additional time for separation from a therapist.

The Board chair concluded that there was no showing of extraordinary circumstances sufficient to warrant an extension beyond April 6, 2009. The Board's oral decision issued on February 2, 2009 gave the respondent forty-four days to assist his patients in finding alternative sources of assistance. The written decision in this matter was issued on March 6, 2009 granting summary decision and revoking the license of Dr. Krass to practice psychology effective March 16, 2009.

A motion was made by Dr. Roy and seconded by Dr. Groveman to go into executive session to obtain legal advice on the issues raised by the Motion and to consider the decision rendered by Dr. Friedman to extend the effective date of revocation of the license of Dr. Krass to April 6, 2009.

Upon deliberating in executive session a motion was made by Dr. Brickfield and seconded by Dr. Roy to return to open session. All were in favor.

After consideration of the motion papers with submissions, a motion was made by Dr. Groveman and seconded by Dr. Roy to ratify the Chair's decision to move the effective date of the revocation of Dr. Krass' license to practice psychology in New Jersey from March 16, 2009 to April 6, 2009. Voting in favor of the motion: all.
