

# **New Jersey State Board of Physical Therapy**

## **Public Session Minutes September 24, 2002**

The Board will advise Ms. Aaron that a physician's prescription must be present before any physical therapy treatment is rendered.

The Board considered an inquiry submitted by Ms. Brower, a physical therapist, employed within a school system. Ms. Brower wrote to the Board to inquire whether it is permissible for her to provide gross motor group therapy to students without possessing a teacher's certificate and without all of the student's possessing a physician referral. The Board will advise Ms. Brower that teacher's certificates are not within the Board's jurisdiction and therefore the Board can offer no guidance on that aspect of her question; however, a physical therapist may provide physical therapy instruction to a group without a physician referral according to a case decision in 1990.

## **O. CORRESPONDENCE FROM TOM FUTCH RE: COMPLIANCE WITH GOVERNING ADMINISTRATION OF PHYSICAL THERAPY SERVICES**

The Board reviewed an inquiry from Mr. Futch, President of Meridian Healthcare Group, who wrote to the Board to inquire whether a physical therapist can delegate tasks to respiratory therapists. The Board will advise Mr. Futch that respiratory therapists must establish their own plan of care and that physical therapists cannot supervise them.

## **P. INQUIRY FROM NATALYA PERLOV RE: EMG/NCV**

The Board considered the inquiry submitted by Ms. Perlov, who wrote to the Board to inquire whether it is permissible for physical therapist to perform EMG/NCV testing under the supervision of a physician. The Board will advise Ms. Perlov that this is not permissible.
