Rules of the Board of Examiners of Heating, Ventilating, Air Conditioning, and Refrigeration Contractors

Take notice that pursuant to N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1, the rules at N.J.A.C. 13:32A were scheduled to expire on April 15, 2020. The rules establish licensing and regulation of standards for the master heating, air conditioning, and refrigeration ventilating, contractors. Subchapter 1 contains rules [page=480] establishing the purpose of Chapter 32A and definitions of terms used throughout the chapter. Subchapter 2 contains rules regarding applications for licensure and Subchapter 3 addresses licensure renewal requirements. Subchapter 4 establishes continuing education requirements. Subchapter 5 requires heating, ventilating, air licensed master conditioning, and refrigeration contractors to have their names, business name, and license number on commercial vehicles, business correspondence, advertisements. The subchapter also establishes registration requirements for bona fide representatives and standards for the supervision of unlicensed individuals providing services. Subchapter 6 sets forth the fees charged by the Board.

The Board of Examiners of Heating, Ventilating, Air Conditioning, and Refrigeration Contractors has reviewed the rules and has determined them to be necessary, reasonable, and proper for the purpose for which they were originally promulgated, as required by Executive Order No. 66 (1978). Therefore, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:16A-4, and in accordance with N.J.S.A. 52:14B-5.1.c(1), the rules are readopted without amendments and shall continue in effect for a seven-year period.
