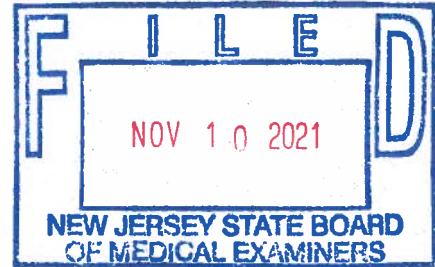

Administrative Action

FINAL CONSENT ORDER

This matter was most recently opened to the New Jersey State Board of Medical Examiners ("Board") upon receipt of information that Abdul Qadir, M.D. ("Respondent") has fully complied with the Interim Consent Order filed on January 21, 2020. Pursuant to that Order, Respondent agreed to undergo a full evaluation and assessment of his general medical knowledge and skill as well as his general knowledge of and ability to safely engage in the prescribing of Controlled Dangerous Substances. Respondent also agreed to fully and satisfactorily follow and complete all of the requirements of the evaluation and assessment as well as any recommendations made with regard to additional evaluations, practice parameters

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and professional education. Respondent agreed to complete the assessment within four months of the filing of the Interim Consent Order and to provide the results of the evaluation to the Board.

On March 9 and 10, 2020, Respondent participated in an evaluation with the Center for Personalized Education for Professionals ("CPEP") which encompassed both his pharmacological as well as interventional pain management skills. The CPEP report indicated that he demonstrated an acceptable fund of medical knowledge with some areas for improvement, that his clinical judgement and reasoning were mostly good with a few areas for enhancement, and that his charts contained all pertinent components and were appropriately detailed. The report concluded that Respondent demonstrated minimal educational needs. In addition, a neuropsychological evaluation found Respondent's overall cognitive functioning broadly within the normal range.

Based upon the CPEP and neuropsychological evaluations as well as submissions provided by Respondent's counsel detailing improvements made to his client's practice of medicine and additional prescribing courses he has taken since the matter was opened, the Board finds that Respondent has fully and satisfactorily completed all of the requirements of the evaluation and assessment. Thus, the Board further finds that the within disposition is adequately protective of the public health, safety and welfare, and other good cause having been shown,

IT IS, therefore, on this 10th day of November, 2021,

ORDERED THAT:

1. Abdul Qadir, M.D., having fully and satisfactorily complied with the terms and conditions of the Board's January 21, 2020 Order, is hereby granted an unrestricted license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of New Jersey.

2. Entry of this Order is without prejudice to further action, investigation, and prosecution by this Board, the Attorney General, the Drug Control Unit, the Director of the Division of Consumer Affairs or other law enforcement entities based upon Respondent's conduct prior to or subsequent to entry of this Order.
