Limitations On and Obligations Associated with Prescriber Acceptance of Compensation from Pharmaceutical Manufacturers

Notice Regarding Modest Meals

Take notice that the Division of Consumer Affairs (Division) is publishing this notice to provide the regulated community with updated information regarding the dollar limits for "modest meals" at N.J.A.C. 13:45J-1.2. The rules set forth at N.J.A.C. 13:45J were promulgated by the Attorney General, in accordance with the statutory authority conferred at N.J.S.A. 45:1-17.b. See 50 N.J.R. 578(a) (January 16, 2018). The rules "regulate the receipt and acceptance by prescribers of anything of value from pharmaceutical manufacturers to ensure that such relationships do not interfere with prescribers' independent professional judgment." N.J.A.C. 13:45J-1.1(a).

The rules permit prescribers who are not speaking or providing services at promotional activities to accept modest meals provided by manufacturers through promotional activities. See N.J.A.C. 13:45J-1.2, 1.3(d), and 1.4(a)4. N.J.A.C. 13:45J-1.2 set the amount of "modest meals" at \$ 15.00 (for breakfast or lunch) and \$ 30.00 (for dinner), in 2018, for each prescriber.

The definition of "modest meals" contains a self-executing method for adjusting these amounts over time. This rule states that "[i]n each succeeding calendar year after 2018, these amounts shall be adjusted if the Consumer Price Index reflects a sum, which, if rounded, consistent with the definition of 'Consumer Price Index,' would raise it by one dollar increments." N.J.A.C. 13:45JH-1.2 defines "Consumer Price Index" as [page=1748]"the annual average, rounded to the nearest dollar, of the Consumer Price Index for Food Away From Home--Northeast Urban, as posted in January for the preceding year by the U.S. Department of Labor Bureau of Labor Statistics at <http://www.bls.gov/>, or a successor index. To round, amounts under 50 cents shall be disregarded, and amounts of 50 cents or more shall be increased to the next dollar."

The table below reflects the limits on "modest meals" for each year since 2018, according to the self-executing formula set forth at N.J.A.C. 13:45J-1.2. As stated in the table below, the modest meal limits for 2022 are \$ 17.00 for breakfast and lunch and \$ 35.0 for dinner.
