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THE ART THERAPISTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE PUBLIC SESSION MINUTES OCTOBER 16, 2018

I. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>

The Art Therapists Advisory Committee was called to order at 9:36 a.m. by Annette Vaccaro in the Sussex Conference Room, 6th floor, 124 Halsey Street, Newark, NJ.

VI. <u>ADMINISTRATIVE REPORT</u>

Milagros Collazo, Executive Director, informed the Committee that she is currently working on a draft for the jurisprudence orientation as well as the application forms. The drafts will be available for Committee review as the approval process for the regulations is closer.

VII. <u>LEGISLATIVE / REGULATORY</u>

A. Assembly Bill 1531- FYI Only

The Committee reviewed the Bill, which revises law concerning reciprocity for out-of-State professional and occupational licenses (Signed into law as P.L.2018, c.78. 8/10/18). *The Committee accepted this as informational.*

B. 38 CFR Part 17-FYI Only

The Committee reviewed 38 CFR Part 17 which is a Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) amendment of its medical regulations by standardizing the delivery of care by VA health care providers through telehealth.

The Committee accepted this as informational.

C. PL 2018, c34-Amends N.J.S.A. 2A:62A-16- FYI Only

The Committee reviewed PL 2018, C34 which is regarding health care professionals' duty to warn and protect and amending P.L.1991, c.270.

The Committee accepted this as informational.

D. Senate Bill 2929

The Committee reviewed the Bill, which establishes local drug overdose fatality review teams in each county in State.

The Committee accepted this as informational.

E. Assembly Bill 4381- FYI Only

The Committee reviewed Bill which will require public high school students to receive instruction concerning opioid abuse and opioid abuse prevention.

The Committee accepted this as informational.

F. Assembly Bill 3728

A member of the public in attendance, presented the Committee with copies of the Bill which seeks to provide exemption to licensing requirements for certain art therapists.

The Committee did not comment on the Bill, as it is the same as Assembly Bill 4650, which the Committee had voted not to support on August 15, 2017. Same was noted on the minutes.

G. Chapter 341

The Board reviewed the amendment to Chapter 341concerning controlled dangerous substance and prescription monitoring. The law mandates one continuing education credit of prescription opioid abuse, but does not specifically mention art therapists.

The Committee determined not to make the continuing education credit mandatory for its licensees. The Committee stated that it values the information that can be obtained from taking continuing education credits in this topic for art therapists working with this population, but at this time will not make it a requirement for licensure renewal.

VIII. <u>NEW BUSINESS</u>

A. Jurisprudence Orientation discussion.

Ms. Collazo, Executive Director, informed the Committee that the jurisprudence orientation draft is a work in progress. Ms. Collazo is using the Dentistry Board's jurisprudence as a guide to draft the Committee's orientation.

B. The 3RD quarterly report for Fiscal Year 2018 is presented for review *The Committee accepted this as informational.*
