1. DISCUSSION WITH HVACR BOARD, PLUMBING BOARD, AND DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AFFAIRS, TRENTON
N.J.S.A 52:27D-509 "PROPANE GAS CUSTOMER PROTECTION ACT"

On July 28, 2011, the Board discussed this topic and welcomed comments from those in the Public Session. Subsequent to the discussion, a motion was made by Michael Maloney and seconded by James McManus, that (a) all Licensed Master Plumbers will be required to fulfill their Continuing Education requirements which will incorporate a new phase of training in LP Gas/propane; (b) Apprentices are gaining their LP Gas/Propane training through their formal apprenticeship training. A vote was taken and the motion unanimously passed.

2. INQUIRY FROM ROBERT W. SMITH, ATTORNEY AT LAW, SMITH, SMITH & CURLEY, JULY 8, 2011 LETTER ENTITLED: INQUIRY RESPECTING PLUMBING CONTRACTOR

On July 28, 2011, the Board acknowledged receipt of this inquiry and concluded in a motion made by Robert Reeve and seconded by Michael Maloney, directing Robert W. Smith, Attorney at Law, toward New Jersey Plumbing Statutes and Regulations, at:

NJ.A.C. 13:32-3.3 Bona fide representative responsibilities (a) A bona fide representative registered with the Board pursuant to N.J.A.C. 13:32-3.2 shall:

(5). Serve as a bona fide representative for only one plumbing contractor.

A vote was taken and the motion unanimously passed.

DISCIPLINARY MATTER

3. IN THE MATTER OF THE APPLICATION OF **JASON PENTA**FOR A PLUMBING LICENSE IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY
ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION, CONSENT ORDER FILED 6-23-2011

This matter was opened to the State Board of Examiners of Master Plumbers upon receipt of an application for examination for a plumbing license from Jason Penta, Respondent, who had indicated on his application that he had been convicted of criminal offenses. Consent Order states in part:

JASON PENTA

CONSENT ORDER FILED 6-23-2011, Continued

Respondent is permitted to sit for the master plumber's examination and upon passage of same and other license requirements, shall be granted a license subject to restrictions in this order. Penta shall submit to an alcohol/substance abuse evaluation by a licensed alcohol and drug counselor at his own expense and the counselor shall receive prior approval from the Board. The counselor shall notify the Board and submit a full report to the Board.

The Board reserves the right to enter a subsequent order. Respondent consents to an automatic suspension of license should the Board establish that he has violated this order. Respondent has the right to apply for a hearing regarding the removal of such automatic suspension on five (5) days notice.

The Board proceeded into Executive Closed Session with respect approval of alcohol/substance abuse counselors, and returned to Open Public Session to report the approval of the facilities and counselors identified by Mr. Rescinio, Esq., in his letter of June 10, 2011.

4. DISCIPLINARY MATTER

OFFER OF SETTLEMENT IN LIEU OF DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDING SCOTT DURNIN, LMP # 10347, t/a AMERISERVE PLUMBING CONSTRUCTION VIOLATIONS FROM CLINTON TOWNSHIP CONSTRUCTION OFFICE, LEBANON, NJ OWNER IN FEE: PATULLO, 27 MEADOWVIEW DRIVE, AND CHRIS ANN JAYE, CONDO OWNERS, (2) VIOLATIONS RE AIR HANDLER/HEAT PUMP/ NO PERMITS: \$500 PENALTY PAID 6/23/2011

Licensed Master Plumber Scott Durnin, Plumbing License No. 10347, was fined \$500 for his failing to obtain a permit for the job he performed at the above job site.

5. **WALTER D. WINNER, JR., LMP # 9349**

IN THE MATTER OF THE SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF LICENSE TO PRACTICE PLUMBING IN THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY PROVISIONAL ORDER OF DISCIPLINE FILED 6-23-2011

WALTER D. WINNER, JR., LMP # 9349

Order states in part:

Respondent's license to practice as a Master Plumber in the State of New Jersey is hereby provisionally suspended pursuant to NJSA 45:1-21(e) for failing to cooperate with an investigation of the Board by failing to provide information in response to the complaint received from consumer JG in violation of NJAC 13:45c-1.3. His license shall remain suspended until such time as respondent appears before the Board to answer questions concerning the complaint from consumer J.G.

Respondent is hereby provisionally assessed a civil penalty in the amount of \$2,500 for failing to cooperate with the Board's investigation and not providing requested information. His license is suspended until he pays the penalty. The within Order shall be subject to finalization on the 30th business day following entry unless the respondent requests a modification or dismissal of the above stated Findings of Fact or Conclusion of Law.

6. CHRIS WODASH, APPLICANT, MASTER PLUMBERS EXAMINATION INQUIRY DATED JUNE 24, 2011 - RE ACCREDITATION OF COLLEGE

On July 28, 2011, the Board held a discussion concerning this matter, and concluded in a motion made by Robert Reeve and seconded by Michael Maloney, that Thomas Edison College is an accredited college; however, Mr. Wodash must fulfill the qualifications for the Master Plumber's examination, according to existing New Jersey Plumbing Statutes and Regulations, including one year of practical experience in the trade.

A vote was taken and the motion unanimously passed.

7. ROBERT HAHAN, APPRENTICESHIP COORDINATOR FOR SOMERSET COUNTY - RARITAN VALLEY COMMUNITY COLLEGE CORRESPONDENCE DATED JUNE 16, 2011

RE: ON LINE PHCC APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAM

On July 28, 2011, Members discussed this inquiry and agreed, in a motion made by James McManus and seconded by Michael Sestanovich, to send a clarification letter to Mr. Hahan stating that the State Board of Examiners of Master Plumbers does not approve apprenticeship programs. Such programs are approved by the United States Department of Labor, and upon their approval, are recognized by the Board toward qualifying applicants for the Master Plumber's examination.

A vote was taken and the motion unanimously passed

PROMETRIC, TESTING SERVICE, Master Plumber's examination

On July 28, 2011, Members discussed scheduling a review of test content for the Master Plumber's examination. The Board also considered inviting representatives from Prometric to attend a future meeting to consider changes to the examination and incorporating new material.

◆ It is noted that applications for the Master Plumber's
examination, Master Plumber's business registration forms, and Bona fide Representative registrations are reviewed by Board Members during the course of each business meeting.

Applications for Medical Gas Piping installers, brazers and instructors are also reviewed at this time.

Application review also includes, and is not limited to, Child support obligations and the reporting of crimes including DUIs or DWIs.

NOT ON THE PUBLISHED AGENDA

OPRA MATTER -

Deputy Attorney General Steve Flanzman, Division of Law In the matter of providing "Applicants for examination" Mercer County, NJ

On July 28, 2011, subsequent to a discussion in Executive Closed Session, the Board returned to Open Public Session, and in a motion made by Michael Maloney and seconded by James McManus, the Board approved a payment of \$2,230 to be divided between the State Board of Examiners of Master Plumbers and Board of Examiners of Electrical Contractors in order to settle the litigation pending at the Division of Consumer Affairs/ Division of Law.

Mercer County challenged an Opra request that requires applicants approved by the Board for the Master Plumber's examination be made available, and on July 28, 2011, Members approved the settlement.

A vote was taken and the motion unanimously passed.

EXECUTIVE CLOSED SESSION MOTION:

A motion was made by Michael Maloney and seconded by Robert Reeve to proceed into Executive Closed Session to review consumer complaint matters, conduct one (1) investigative inquiry, discuss unlicensed advertisements, unlicensed practice matters, consider administrative closings, investigations of possible violations of applicable law, pending or anticipated litigation, matters under investigation, the DAG caseload, and review matters within the attorney-client relationship exception to the Open Public Meetings Act. A vote was taken and the motion unanimously passed.
